Accreditation and History

LCSC is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities. The baccalaureate Nursing program is approved by the Idaho State Board of Nursing and accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). The Teacher Education program is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education and the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification. The Social Work program is accredited by the National Council of Social Work Education. Select baccalaureate majors from the Business Division are accredited by the International Assembly for Collegiate Business Education. The associate Medical Assisting program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs.

LCSC was established by an act of the Idaho State Legislature in 1893. Originally designated the Lewiston State Normal School, it has since been Northern Idaho College of Education and Lewis-Clark Normal School. Present name, Lewis-Clark State College, was authorized in 1971.

LCSC observes an early semester calendar of 16 weeks. Summer session courses vary from 2 to 11 weeks in length but meet for the same contact hours as the semester-long courses unless noted otherwise.

Transfer and Awarded Credits

LCSC will award credit or prior learning through CLEP, Portfolio, Military, Challenge Exams, International Baccalaureate Programme and Advanced Placement. These credits are clearly designated as such as should be considered part of the student's degree program. Transfer credits from regionally accredited colleges will be noted on the transcript. Prior to 1994, specific courses were listed; after 1994, a summary of credits are listed. Grades earned at other institutions are not used in calculating cumulative GPA.

Course Numbering

000 - 099 developmental education; 100 - 299 lower division; 300 - 499 upper division.

Prior to 1994, Learning Support English, Math, and Reading were designated as LSE, LSM, LSR; after 1994 these courses were listed as LE, LM, and LR. Beginning in 1998, developmental education courses had 000 - 099 numbers. These are not degree credit courses.

Good Standing - cumulative GPA is 2.00 or higher

Academic Warning - below 2.00 but above probation standard

Academic Probation - 0 - 6 attempted credits, 1.00; 7 - 32 attempted credits, 1.60; 33 - 64 attempted credits, 1.8; 65+ attempted credits, 2.00.

Academic Suspension - student's previous term status is Warning or Probation, either as a result of semester grades or admission status, and the semester GPA is below 2.00.
