Lewis-Clark State College makes it **easy to transfer** from EASTERN IDAHO TECHNICAL COLLEGE (EITC). We offer a broad range of academic and technical majors at our campus. Furthermore, we value the time and effort you've put into your education at EITC. The purpose of this guide is to show you which EITC courses match up with courses taught at LCSC.

Admission Requirements:

Students who have completed at least 14 transferable semester credits from EITC with a 2.0 cumulative GPA or above will be accepted to LCSC. Students with less than a 2.0 cumulative GPA may be accepted on either warning or probation status OR may be denied admission, depending upon the total credits taken and cumulative GPA earned.

Admission Procedures:

- 1) Submit admission application with \$35 non-refundable processing fee. You may also apply at our web site.
- 2) Have EITC and any other college transcripts sent directly to the LCSC Office of Admission from the issuing institution.
- 3) If you have less than 14 transferable semester credits you must also submit final high school transcripts or GED scores as well as ACT or SAT scores.

Financial Aid:

If you have received financial aid at EITC, you may use the renewal application to apply for financial aid at LCSC by indicating on the form that LCSC is the school of choice. You may also apply for financial aid by completing the FAFSA and returning it to the federal processor.

NOTE: The priority deadline for financial aid is March 1. Your renewal application or FAFSA must be received by the federal processor by this date and you must have your admission materials submitted to the LCSC Office of Admission by this date.

Scholarships:

The application deadline for scholarships is March 1. For scholarship consideration, you must have your admission materials submitted to and received by the Office of Admission by this date. In some cases, you may need to complete a separate scholarship application which can be obtained by calling the Financial Aid Office.

Student Housing:

LCSC offers many choices in residence halls, cooperative houses, and some house rentals at its Lewiston campus. Inquiries about housing should be made early in the year prior to the semester you wish to enroll.

Advising/Course Registration:

Once you are admitted to LCSC, information about orientation, advising, and registration will be sent to you. Registration for LCSC courses generally begins in April. If you are planning to enroll at LCSC, you will be asked to contact Career and Advising Services to schedule an advising and registration appointment.

Nursing:

The faculty of the BSN Program at Lewis-Clark State College are committed to excellence in nursing education and firmly believe in educational mobility for individuals within the profession. Credit may be awarded for Nursing, Core, Support, and General Education courses through CLEP tests and the Advanced Placement Program. College credit nursing courses completed with a grade of "C" or better at another institution will be evaluated on an individual basis by the nursing faculty. RN and LPN students may opt to challenge selected nursing courses when appropriate.

The Idaho Statewide Nursing Articulation Committee has developed articulation agreements among and between various levels of Idaho nursing education from practical nursing through baccalaureate nursing education.
