

MILITARY SCIENCE (SOCIAL SCIENCES DIVISION)

MS-101 INTRODUCTION TO MILITARY SCIENCE (1 cr.) This course may not be repeated. Introduction to mission and organization of the US Army; provides background in role of an Army officer as a career choice in either the Active Army or the National Guard/Reserves; lecture, conference, and activities dealing with military subjects; texts provided by dept; no mandatory uniform wear; students learn about available scholarships and other financial programs. Participation entails no military obligation. Co-requisites: Concurrent registration in MS 111.

MS-102 FUNDAMENTALS OF LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT (1 cr.) This course may not be repeated. Continuation of MS 101. Development of greater understanding of roles and responsibilities of Army officers; lecture, conference, and activities dealing with military subjects; texts provided by dept; more focus on leadership development and the development of personal confidence. Participation entails no military obligation. Co-requisites: Concurrent registration in MS 112.

MS-111 LEADERSHIP LAB (1 cr.) This course may not be repeated. Building fundamental characteristics of leadership using a military model; hands-on training in small group leadership. Option of participating in challenging outdoor activities such as whitewater rafting, mountaineering, rifle marksmanship, and rappelling. Two hours of lab every other week. Co-requisites: Concurrent registration in MS 101.

MS-112 LEADERSHIP LAB (1 cr.) This course may not be repeated. Building fundamental characteristics of leadership using a military model; hands-on training in small group leadership. Option of participating in challenging outdoor activities such as whitewater rafting, mountaineering, rifle marksmanship, and rappelling. Two hours of lab every other week. Co-requisites: Concurrent registration in MS 102.

MS-201 APPLIED LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT (2 cr.) This course may not be repeated. Application of leadership and management skills to various case studies; organization and structure of Army units; texts provided by dept. Participation entails no military obligation. Pre-requisites: MS 102 or permission of department. Co-requisite: Concurrent registration in MS 211.

MS-202 APPLIED LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT (2 cr.) This course may not be repeated. Troop leading procedures and application of procedures to planning and conducting small unit operations; individual soldier skills, such as military communication, basic map reading, and survival skills; texts provided by dept. Participation entails no military obligation. Pre-requisite: MS 201 or permission of department. Co-requisite: Concurrent registration in MS 212.

MS-211 LEADERSHIP LAB (1 cr.) This course may not be repeated. Building fundamental characteristics of leadership using a military model; hands-on training in small group leadership. Practical field training in variety of outdoor skills (mountaineering, rafting, rifle marksmanship). Uniform wear not mandatory. Two hours of lab every other week. Co-requisites: Concurrent registration in MS 201.

MS-212 LEADERSHIP LAB (1 cr.) This course may not be repeated. Building fundamental characteristics of leadership using a military model; hands-on training in small group leadership. Practical field training in variety of outdoor skills (mountaineering, rafting,

rifle marksmanship). Uniform wear not mandatory. Two hours of lab every other week. Co-requisites: Concurrent registration in MS 202.

MS-280 RAIDER OPERATIONS (1-4 cr.) The Chrisman Raider Team is an elite group of individuals who compete on intercollegiate level in military skills of marksmanship, physical fitness, navigation, weapons, rope bridging, and long distance marching; rigorous physical training and practicing technical skills in preparation for two-day competition among schools throughout Western US. Prerequisite: Permission of department.

MS-288 COLOR GUARD/DRILL TEAM (1-4 cr.) Participation and training in color guard and drill team. Co-requisites: MS 101 or 102 or 201 or 202 or 301 or 302 or 401 or 402.

MS-289 BASIC ENCAMPMENT (6 cr.) Intensive four-week summer encampment at Fort Knox, Kentucky; hands-on training in fundamentals of leadership in a military environment, land navigation, weapons training, drill and ceremony, and basic skills in doctrinal tactics employed by light infantry leaders. Pre-requisites: 50 cr hrs, 2.0 GPA, and permission of department head.

MS-290 DIRECTED STUDY IN MILITARY SCIENCE (1-12 cr.)

MS-291 WORKSHOP IN MILITARY SCIENCE (1-12 cr.)

MS-292 SPECIAL TOPICS IN MILITARY SCIENCE (1-12 cr.) Pre-requisites: by permission.

MS-295 PRACTICUM IN MILITARY SCIENCE (1-12 cr.)

MS-296 COOPERATIVE EDUCATION IN MILITARY SCIENCE (1-12 cr.)

MS-299 RESEARCH ASSISTANTSHIP (1-12 cr.)

MS-301 ADVANCED LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT (3 cr.) Practical leadership skills in a light infantry environment; leadership techniques practiced while learning patrolling and offensive and defensive tactics at squad and platoon level; prepares cadets for four-week Leadership Training and Assessment course at Fort Lewis, Washington. Three hours of lecture a week. Pre-requisites: MS-202 or permission. Co-requisite: MS 311.

MS-302 ADVANCED LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT (3 cr.) Practical leadership skills in a light infantry environment; leadership techniques practiced while learning patrolling and offensive and defensive tactics at squad and platoon level; prepares cadets for four-week Leadership Training and Assessment course at Fort Lewis, Washington. Three hours of lecture a week. Pre-requisites: MS 301 or permission. Co-requisite: MS 312.

MS-311 LEADERSHIP LAB (1 cr.) Building fundamental characteristics of leadership using a military model; hands-on training in small group leadership. Two hours of lab every other week. Co-requisites: MS 301.

MS-312 LEADERSHIP LAB (1 cr.) Building fundamental characteristics of leadership using a military model; hands-on training in small group leadership. Two hours of lab every other week. Co-requisites: MS 302.

MS-390 DIRECTED STUDY IN MILITARY SCIENCE (1-12 cr.)

MS-401 SEMINAR IN LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT (3 cr.) Practical application of leadership and management skills, military justice system, administrative and logistical procedures; preparation for service as an Army lieutenant. Pre-requisites: MS 301 and 302. Co-requisites: MS 411.

MS-402 SEMINAR IN LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT (3 cr.) Practical application of leadership and management skills, military justice system, administrative and logistical procedures; preparation for service as an Army lieutenant. Pre-requisites: MS 301 and 302. Co-requisites: MS 412.

MS-411 LEADERSHIP LAB (1 cr.) Building fundamental characteristics of leadership using a military model; hands-on training in small group leadership. Two hours of lab every other week. Co-requisites: MS 401.

MS-412 LEADERSHIP LAB (1 cr.) Building fundamental characteristics of leadership using a military model; hands-on training in small group leadership. Two hours of lab every other week. Co-requisites: MS 402.

MS-471 COMMAND AND STAFF FUNCTIONS (2 cr.) Hands-on practical applications of functions of US Army officers assigned to command and staff positions; planning, coordinating, and implementing operations, training and logistic support for cadet battalion activities; practical exercises in interrelationships between commander, staff, higher headquarters, and subordinate units. Co-requisites: MS 401 and 402.

MS-472 COMMAND AND STAFF FUNCTIONS (2 cr.) Hands-on practical applications of functions of US Army officers assigned to command and staff positions; planning, coordinating, and implementing operations, training and logistic support for cadet battalion activities; practical exercises in interrelationships between commander, staff, higher headquarters, and subordinate units. Co-requisites: MS 401 and 402.

MS-489 Leadership Development Assessment Course (1-12 cr.) Intensive and broad-ranging leadership training provided to cadets at Fort Lewis over a four week period during the summer. Cadets are assessed on their ability to lead units ranging from 11-135 persons, to master a variety of physical and mental challenges, and to exhibit composure and leadership skills in stressful situations. Pre-requisites: MS 301 and 302 and permission of department.
