Clearwater Hall Date Constructed: 2006

Located on the southwest corner of Fifth and Main streets in Lewiston's historic district, Clearwater Hall is a four-story building constructed in 2006 at a cost of \$6.2 million by ConoverBond Development of Spokane and Seattle. Lewis-Clark State College purchased the building as a student residence hall in 2009 for \$4.5 million.

The upper three floors feature 32 finished suites, each with a common kitchen/living area and four or five private single bedrooms. Each bedroom is furnished with a bed, a wardrobe, a study desk and chair, and connections for telephone, cable television, and wireless Internet. Each of the common kitchens/living areas is furnished with a full-sized refrigerator, a microwave, a dining table, and two chairs as well as with sofas, chairs, and coffee tables.

A student lounge with a big sofa, a flat screen TV, large study tables and chairs, a foosball table, and a ping-pong table occupies the ground floor of the building.

Clearwater Hall offers apartment style living within walking distance of the campus for both men and women students.
