Meet the Warriors



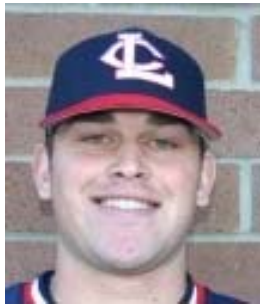
GOLF

Juanita Villa is in her second season on the Warrior women's golf team. She comes to LCSC from Medellin, Columbia. She made an immediate impact in the program after joining the team for the second semester last year and is having an outstanding season this year. During the fall, she was the medalist at both the Montana Tech and Carroll Invationals, finished second at the Rocky Mountain tournament, and then tied for fifth at the Bellingham Invitational, which features several NCAA Division II and III golfers.

This spring, she picked up where she left off by finishing third at the LCSC Invitational.

Juanita's goals are to go to medical school and become a doctor.

She won the LCSC home tournament during the conference portion of the schedule by more than 10 strokes, took second at the Warrior Invitational, and then placed third in the Region I tournament. Her performance helped the Warrior women qualify for nationals, where LCSC placed seventh.

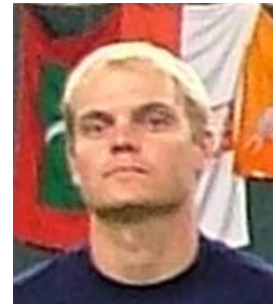


BASEBALL

Beau Mills enters the month of April with some remarkable numbers. He tied a school record in a game last month against Gonzaga when he went 6-of-7, tying the school record for most hits in a game.

Mills, who is the son of the Boston Red Sox bench coach Brad Mills, has professional scouts drooling over his solid play at third base. At press time, Mills led LCSC in hitting (.465), hits (47), home runs (9), RBI (44), and is tied for the league in runs (39). He has started all but one game for the top-ranked Warriors.

Mills is a junior from Visalia, Calif., and is majoring in Criminal Justice at LCSC. Mills played two seasons at Fresno State University before transferring to LCSC.



TENNIS

Andy Hunt has been an integral part of the Warrior tennis program for the past four years. The senior from Boise, who LCSC coach Kai Fong says is one of the hardest working players on the team, posted a 34-25 record for a .576 winning percentage during his first three seasons.

This year, Hunt is a key reason why the Warriors are ranked No. 18 in the country and should be heading back to nationals after two impressive 9-0 victories over the University of Alberta. The NAIA has changed the its qualification criteria for the national tournament and the top-ranked team from each region will receive a berth. LCSC and Alberta have the only men's team in Region I. Hunt plays both singles and doubles for L-C.
