# Meet the Warriors



## VOLLEYBALL

**Brittney Kubik** is one of two seniors on the Warrior women's volleyball team and will be counted on to provide leadership this season. She came to LCSC last season after two years at Walla Walla Community College and had an impressive year with 155 kills, which ranked fourth on the team. She led the team with a .218 hitting percentage, 24 solo blocks, 60 block assists, and 84 blocks. The 6-foot middle blocker from Ritzville, Washington saw action in 26 matches and 84 games.

She had an excellent career at WWCC where she earned Junior College First-Team All-American honors in 2005 and was the East Region's MVP. She led Walla Walla to the conference tournament title and was the tournament's MVP.

Kubik also excelled in the classroom. She was one of four team members to earn Frontier Conference All-Academic honors. She is majoring in Kinesiology.

The volleyball team plays its first home match of the regular season on Sept. 13 against the University of Great Falls.



## CROSS COUNTRY

**Calin Hantau** is coming off a big season where he earned All-American status by finishing 10th at the NAIA national meet. He was timed in 25 minutes, 2.85 seconds to post the best finish by a Warrior male runner at the meet.

Calin, a senior, transferred to LCSC prior to last season and immediately made an impact. He was the team's top finisher in every race he competed in. He also was second at the region meet and holds the program record for 8 kilometers.

Calin was born in Sighisoara, Romania and has one brother, Alin. In high school in Romania, he won two indoor and three outdoor running titles in his freshman and sophomore years, and also won a cross country title. During his junior year, he participated in the World Youth Championships.

Calin's personal best times include 3:47 in the 1,500 meters, 8:20 in the 3,000, 14:50 over 5 kilometers, 24:24 over 8 kilometers, and 30:40 over 10 kilometers.

Calin's only home race this season is the LCSC Invitational on Oct. 20 at Hells Gate State Park.



## GOLF

**Cortney Shrou**, a 5-foot-3 sophomore from Okanogan, Washington, enjoyed a solid freshman season for the Warriors, helping the team place 13<sup>th</sup> in the NAIA Women's Golf Championships last spring in San Diego.

Shrou was the team's top finisher in the four-day event as she shot a 328 – an average of 82 per round. Her score placed her tied for No. 52 overall in the tournament.

Shrou, who is majoring in Business Administration with an emphasis in Accounting, also helped the Warriors finish second in the Frontier Conference standings. The Frontier Conference plays both a fall and spring golf schedule because some of the Montana courses aren't playable for most of the spring.

At Okanogan High, she placed third and fourth her final two years in the state tournament. She also played on the volleyball team.

The Warrior women's golf team lost only one senior from a year ago and should challenge to be a Top 10-ranked team in the NAIA this year.
