ASLCSC-CDA Hosts First Book Exchange

After hearing the news that the NIC bookstore would no longer be carrying textbooks for LCSC-CDA courses, concern quickly spread among the student body regarding the availability of used books at discounted prices, as well as the ability to recapture some funds by selling books back after they

had served their purpose. Your student government responded by establishing the first LCSC-CDA Book Exchange.

After spending two days collecting 169 textbooks and one day organizing them, the ASLCSC-CDA Book Exchange sold almost 50 books over the next two days. One lucky student found nine

of the textbooks that she needed at the book exchange saving her hundreds of dollars versus buying them new.

Due to the success of the book exchange, the student government is confident that this will become a tradition for years to come. Thank you to all of the students who participated in this event.

Activities: Hockey Game! Story by: Tony Parks

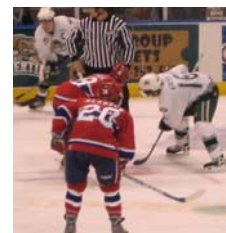
