This organization provides professional social workers with a forum for discussing social issues, policy formation and advocacy for jobs on the state and local levels. NASW is also a voice for “disenfranchised populations”, such as women, the elderly and working poor who are not

always able to speak for themselves.

Although this new role on the NASW puts new demands on JR’s schedule, he does not allow it to take away from his teaching and working with students.
