LCSC-CDA Enrollment Increasing Steadily

Enrollment at LCSC-CDA increased by 15 percent this year, and is up 40 percent since 2001.

The student body is made up of a diverse 367 people. Of that number a large majority are students seeking a degree in Business. There are 112 such students currently enrolled. Nursing is a close second with 88 students. From there it jumps down to Social Work at 43, Communications has 27, Justice Studies at 24, Interdisciplinary Studies with

21, Education has 20, and Social Sciences currently has 3 students seeking their degrees from LCSC-CDA. There are also another 27 students majoring in other fields.

President Dean K. Thomas credits the faculty and staff at the Coeur d'Alene campus, "We've continued to make solid progress in all areas. I'm very proud of the commitment of the faculty and staff, which has led the way."

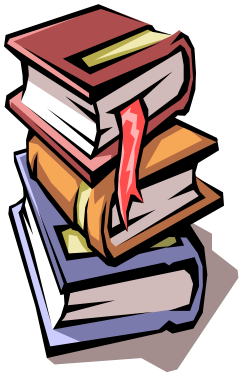
National recognition has probably played a role as well.

LCSC has been named one of the top comprehensive bachelor's degree-offering public colleges in the West for 5 straight years by U.S. News and World Report.

The growth is especially surprising considering economic trends. Director of LCSC-CDA, Cyndie Hammond, has pointed out that enrollment is usually down when unemployment is down, but the low unemployment figures in Kootenai County contradict this trend.
