A Note on Foundation Funding

Several departments from LCSC seek funding from foundations such as Idaho Community Foundation, Idaho Commission on the Arts, and the Idaho Humanities Council on an annual basis. Often a foundation will only consider one proposal per institution. Funding foundations may also ask for a 5 year history of all submitted proposals from the institution to that agency. These are just a couple of reasons it is vital to obtain institutional approval before applying for a grant in order to maintain institutional records, comply with funding agency requirements, maintain institutional records, and keep institutional continuity and integrity intact.

The OGC is happy to provide proposal and application histories, and will assist you as much or as little as you need.
