**Lower GE Core Note:** Normally, students who transfer with an earned Bachelor of Arts (BA), Bachelor of Science (BS), Associate of Arts (AA), Associate of Science (AS), or Associate of Arts and Science (AA&S) degree from any United States post-secondary institution accredited by an agency recognized by the Idaho State Board of Education (SBOE) have met the LCSC lower division general education core requirements. Normally, students transferring from any United States post-secondary institution accredited by an agency recognized by the SBOE who have completed the equivalent of the Idaho State Board of Education's general education core, either with an AA, AS, AA&. or have their transcript noted "Core Certified" by the sending institution have normally met the LCSC lower division general education core requirement.

**Timeline for completion:** Students should plan to complete the BSN degree in six or less academic years. Full and part-time study options are available.
