Other materials will be supplied during the orientation program.

Course Description/Purpose: “New Student Orientation” is intended to provide students with information needed to be successful at Lewis-Clark State College. Students will have an opportunity to meet other students, faculty, and staff. These interactions will help students get a sense of the campus culture, and more importantly, teach them how to conduct business with the college. Students will learn about the Student Code of Conduct, academic advising rights and responsibilities, and other policies related to their enrollment at LCSC. In addition, they will meet with faculty/advisors within their programs of study and have the option of taking a campus tour.

Grades: New Student Orientation is graded on a pass/no-credit basis. Students will earn a grade of “pass” for:

- 1) Attending the entire orientation program and participating in all related activities.
- 2) Meeting with their respective academic advisors to complete the SD 107/307 Study Plan and return that plan to the Office of New Student Recruitment (RCH 114) no later than two weeks after orientation - **Friday, January 22, 2010**. Grades may be checked via WarriorWeb.
- 3) Completing the on-line, Blackboard ©-based Plagiarism module and submit a printout of the completed final quiz.
- 4) Printing off their Spring 2010 schedule from WarriorWeb and submit a copy of it with their study plan.
