August 28:	Last day to pay in full or set up payment plan without late fee

MANY OPTIONS TO PAY FOR COLLEGE

- ▶ **Grants** - money you do not have to pay back, (such as Pell Grant), must complete FAFSA
- ▶ **Loans** - money you have to pay back
 - Federal - must complete FAFSA
 - Parent Plus - must complete FAFSA
 - Private - from a lender
 - Personal - from family or friend
- ▶ **Scholarships** - money you do not have to pay back
 - LC State
 - State (e.g. Idaho Opportunity)
 - GEAR UP
 - High School
 - Community Groups
- ▶ **Veterans' Education Benefits**
- ▶ **Savings**
 - College account (e.g. 529 Plans)
 - Personal
- ▶ **Gifts**
 - Graduation
 - Birthday
- ▶ **Work**
 - Current job
 - Future job (off or on campus)

You can **pay on your account NOW!** Log into WarriorWeb, go to Student Accounts and make a payment.

HOW MUCH DO I OWE?

MANY ITEMS GO INTO YOUR BILL

- ▶ **Tuition** - This is what you will pay taking 12+ credits per semester:
 - In State: \$7,388/academic year
\$3,694/semester
 - Out of State: \$21,386 academic year
\$10,693/semester
 - Asotin County Resident: \$11,686 academic year
\$5,843/semester
- ▶ **Fees**
 - Assessed based on number of credits and course fees
- ▶ **Books & Supplies**
 - Average Rate: \$1,400 academic year
\$700/semester
- ▶ **Housing & Meals** (average on campus)
 - \$8,500 academic year
\$4,250/semester
- ▶ **Other costs**
 - Transportation
Fuel, Insurance, Maintenance
 - Personal living expenses

If you have a positive balance, this is what you still need to pay. One helpful way to look at it is this:

Bottom Line ÷ number of weeks until school starts = How much money to save/earn per week.

Can you:

DID YOU KNOW?

- You can also work out a payment plan with Student Accounts giving you two additional months to pay.

WAYS TO SAVE MONEY:

- Books
 - New vs Used vs Rent
- Housing
 - Choose more affordable room and/or meal plan, if living on campus.
 - If living off campus, living expenses are spread through the semester and allow for adjustments
