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

A Quick Disclaimer

- The IPO can provide you with information and resources; however, we are not tax professionals;
- Filing on your own can be a time-consuming and frustrating process;
- International student taxes are different than U.S. resident taxes;
- We highly recommend using a paid international student tax filing service like <u>Sprintax</u>



Types of Taxes in the USA

- Income Tax: Taxes on money you earn
- Sales Tax: Taxes on things you buy
- Excise Tax: Taxes you pay for special goods, like fuel and cigarettes
- Payroll Tax: Social Security and Medicare tax
- Property Tax: Taxes you pay on your property/home
- Estate Tax: Taxes on transferred property when someone dies
- Gift Tax: Taxes you must pay for gifts of cash or goods

Please note: taxes can vary depending on where you live



International Student Taxes

What is taxable income?

- Wages from an on-campus or off-campus job
- Scholarships that pay for room and meal plan

What isn't subject to taxation?

Scholarships that pay for tuition and fees

What about the FICA tax (Social Security/Medicare)?

- Not required to pay if in USA < 5 years
- Employers may withhold from <u>all</u> workers' wages
- You can file for a refund




Who needs to file taxes?

All U.S. international students (non-resident aliens on an F or J visa) must file regardless of whether they have earned an income or not.

*See the flow chart on the next slide to see what forms you need to file based upon your situation





On Your Own


The IRS has partnered with third-party providers to offer free software to file your taxes electronically.

*You may be eligible to use free file software if you are a resident alien for tax purposes. Note: this may not work for everyone!

- IRS Free File <u>Options</u> here you can browse the various software programs that are provided
- IRS Free File Online Lookup Tool- this tool helps you to sort through the software programs to find which works best for you and your tax situation
