This advising guide is based on completion of an Associate's degree (AA/AS) in Secondary Education at the College of Southern Idaho with additions made to meet lower division requirements.
Students who transfer without being core complete may need to take additional LC State General Education core courses.
32 Residency (LC State) credits required for graduation/36 must be upper division.

A minimum grade of "C" or better and a minimum 3.0 GPA is required for all General Education courses. A minimum grade of "B-" or better is required in all Secondary Education Program courses. A minimum GPA of 3.0 must be maintained in the content area and in the cumulative overall grade point average."
