- Dr. Ayodeji Arogundade, associate professor of business and interim chair of the Business & Computer Science Division, has a newly published chapter "Internationalization of Higher Education in Nigeria: Unintended Positive and Negative Consequences" in the edited volume of "Unintended Consequences of Internationalization in Higher Education: Comparative International Perspectives on the Impacts of Policy and Practice," as part of the Routledge Studies in Global Student Mobility series. Congratulations, Dr. Arogundade!
- Dr. Kylee Britzman, assistant professor of political science, co-authored an article "Understanding Electability: The Effects of Implicit and Explicit Sexism on Candidate Perceptions" in the Journal of Women, Politics, and Policy in January 2023. She received the Cascadia Award from the Pacific Northwest Political Science Association (PNWPSA) for her scholarship.
