Dear all,

Last week I shared a few academic/faculty highlights (more to come over these next months – please do share your "brags" with deans and dept/unit heads!), and this week I thought I'd shine a spotlight on athletics. Here's a recap of what's been happening so far... (in alphabetical order \bigcirc):

- Baseball The Warriors are off to a 11-3 start to the season with big wins over some top teams
 in the NAIA. Nick Seamons and Pu'ukani De Sa have both won Cascade Collegiate Conference
 (CCC) Player of the Week honors and Trevin Hope has been named Pitcher of the Week twice.
- Basketball Men's basketball finished sixth in the Cascade Conference with an 11-11 record in CCC play. Women's basketball is ranked 10th in the NAIA and finished the regular season as CCC co-champions. The women play at Eastern Oregon in the CCC conference title game on Tuesday and will host an NAIA Women's Basketball Championship First and Second Round March 7-8. The Warrior women are 28-2 overall on the season and are second in the nation in field goal percentage defense.
- **Golf** Both Warrior golf teams open the spring season March 7-8 at the Rocky Mountain College Intercollegiate in Las Vegas. LC State will host the Warrior Spring Invitational at Lewiston Golf and Country Club in March. Come on out and watch!
- **Tennis** The women's tennis team wrapped up a successful road trip to Louisiana with a 3-2 record. The men took both matches against Whitman over the weekend and are 6-6 on the season.
- Track & Field Track and field has a strong group of Warriors heading to South Dakota for nationals. LC State will be represented by London Kirk, Anika Grogan, Emily Collins, Carter Gordon, Geraldin Correa, Brycen Brown, Madigan Kelly, Sara Hathaway, Jennah Carpenter, Christian Bothwell, Sydnie Zywina and two relay teams at indoor nationals March 2-4.

- Custodial Services Update: There is no longer a need to place trash cans in hallways for
 custodial services. Custodians will empty trash cans within the offices as needed. Additionally,
 classroom cleaning supplies will remain in the classroom for optional use by students and
 faculty.
- Warrior Wellness Zone: The Health and Wellness Committee and the Student Counseling Center have been working to accommodate a need for low-sensory and calming spaces for students to use on campus. Space has been secured within SGC (Room 201) and it is currently being called the Warrior Wellness Zone. Donations are currently being accepted at the Student Counseling Center (SGC 211/212) to provide appropriate supplies and resources for this project. Items needed include: board games, puzzles, brain teasers, coloring books, markers/pens/crayons, post-it notes, etch-a-sketch, white boards, play dough/kinetic sand, plasma ball, bubble wrap, self-help books, fidget toys (stress balls, glitter wand, water snake, fidget cubes/spinners, etc.), magnetic drawing board, magazines, and bubbles.
- **Did You Know?** LC State student-athletes have a combined GPA that is higher than the overall student body at the college? During the 2022 spring semester, LC State had 143 student-athletes with GPAs of 3.0 or better, including 98 with a 3.50 GPA or better. There were 32 student-athletes with perfect 4.0 GPAs. Overall, the student-athlete GPA for the semester was 3.38, which was the second-highest in the 12-member Cascade Collegiate Conference. Learn more about LC athletics at www.lcwarriors.com.
