Recruitment: It is crunch time for applicant conversions. Divisions have had prospective student contact/calling lists for a few weeks now; and given our faculty/staff numbers and our one hour per week shared strategy, we should be about 600 hours into person-to-person outreach and connection. This is critical to our enrollment turnaround. Waiting until the semester ends to make calls, send letters, notes, texts, emails, etc. is too late. These next weeks are when most students and families will make college choice decisions (if they haven't done so already). Retention: Priority Registration for summer and fall 2023 will begin next Monday, April 10, and run through Thursday, April 13, for our current students. Please reach out to your advisees in classes, hallways, offices, and on the courts and fields. Encourage them and guide them through registration for summer/fall now. Early registration is the best way for students to obtain their most ideal schedule, and helps us get an idea about the health of our fall enrollment. March 31 Sign On Disruption: On March 31 at 1 p.m. there will be a four-hour intermittent disruption in logging into the Umbraco web editor and Office 365 applications (Teams, Outlook, OneDrive, etc.). This means that you MAY be temporarily unable to log into Umbraco web editor, Microsoft Teams, Outlook, and OneDrive. During this time, we will be migrating off the F5 Secure Logon for those applications which are being moved into an Azure AD secure login. Therefore, you will instead be presented with a standard Microsoft 365 login screen. You will continue to see the F5 Secure Logon screen when

- signing into VPN, Qualtrics, Handshake, and 25Live. Please note that the link https://lcauth.lcsc.edu will no longer work. Instead, please access your email by going to https://Office365.com. You can visit this page to see examples of the current Secure Logon screen along with an example of the password screen after the change.
