Dear all,

Congratulations again to College Advancement, Athletics, and the Warrior Athletic Association on a very successful <u>Warrior Giving Day</u>! Final numbers have come in and thanks to the incredible generosity of 239 donors (72 alumni, 107 friends, 28 employees, 28 parents and four students), LC State raised **\$136,282** for students and programs. The average gift amount was \$168 and the largest \$2,500. Athletics raised \$122,697 of the total, which is over double what they generated last year! To all who gave, I say a heartfelt thank you. Your generosity is appreciated and will impact Warriors for years to come.

I want to give a shoutout to our Admissions folks, staff and faculty from across divisions and schools for an incredibly successful Warrior 101 day last week. Responding to the need to reach out to prospective students early – we hosted nearly 200 regional junior high school students for an interactive visitation experience. Energy and engagement were high, the weather was terrific, and campus is coming into full bloom. It was a great day to showcase LC State – Go Warriors!

I look forward to seeing you all at the <u>37th annual Art Under the Elms</u> at LC State this week. This incredible event is one of our biggest highlights of the year and includes an artisan marketplace, musical performances, cultural dance presentations, readings, food trucks, and theatre performances, along with Mountainfilm on Tour and art activities. The event is sponsored by the Center for Arts & History (CAH) and coincides with LC State's Family Weekend. I thank College Advancement director Jennie Jones Hall, CAH director Emily Johnsen, and all others involved for their hard work in making this weekend's events possible.

• Operational Updates

- Fleet Management LC State has a new policy for Fleet Management 4.105 as required by an internal audit. The policy establishes procedures for the use of LC vehicles and motorized equipment. As part of the audit requirements, we must track vehicle inspections, maintenance, and fuel usage. Rather than track this manually, LC has purchased a software called Fleetio. The software functions on a desktop/laptop or mobile device. There are several trainings available for vehicle operators/drivers and those that will manage the vehicles for maintenance purposes. We invite you to attend one of the following trainings if you drive an LC owned vehicle. As a driver, if you are unable to attend one of the following trainings, please contact Physical Plant x2247 as all drivers will be required to use the software beginning in May and we can setup additional trainings if needed. - New bookstore/apparel partner Textbook Brokers will join our campus on June 16 in a new location in the SUB/CSL next to the dining hall (formerly SUB 143). During the transition, our current partner Follett, will close on June 9 with our new store beginning operations on June 16 to allow for inventory and fixtures to transfer to the new site (note there is one week without available services). Below is some background and information for moving forward with this new partnership.
 - General information
 - Our partner services (e.g., book/apparel store, food service, campus ID cards, etc.) are required to go out for bid or a request for proposal (RFP) at periodic intervals.
 - An evaluation/RFP team was assembled in the fall 2022 and represented constituents from across campus. The goal was to bring on a new partner with great service and affordability for our students. We were open to many different models including virtual (online presence only), hybrid (mix of virtual and on campus presence), and fully on campus. Regardless of the partner, LC State was going to have an on-campus gift and apparel store, whether through a partner or self-operation.
 - We received great proposals representing all model types (virtual, mix, and on campus).
 - The committee evaluated proposals and then participated in presentations and ultimately chose our finalist in March.
 - Post contract negotiations and the Office of the State Board approval, a final contact was signed in April.
 - Textbook Broker will provide bookstore/apparel services using a hybrid model. The bookstore function will be fully online and the apparel/gift store, called "WarriorWear," will be on campus.
 - For Faculty and Division Chairs
 - Textbook Broker is a full service virtual company on the bookstore side and will be announcing training dates for book adoptions shortly. They have a user-friendly online bookstore site that will create ease of use and visibility into course material pricing and the adoption process. The new partner, Textbook Brokers, is doing fall 2023 adoptions and our old

partner is doing the summer 2023. We will need your assistance in providing timely adoptions during this transition period for fall 2023. Fall 2023 adoptions are due on May 5.

- Book adoption dates Going forward, the following are the contractual book adoption dates that are required to meet the Higher Education Act (associated with Federal Financial Aid) guidelines that require that the cost of education be available to the student at the point of registration, which includes the cost of course materials. This will also help us to source as many used books possible for greater affordability for our students.
 - o Fall March 15
 - o Spring Oct. 15
 - Summer March 15
- For Students
 - The biggest change is that books will NOT be available via an oncampus store. Books, once ordered by the student, will take approximately five days to ship to either the student or the store for pick up.
- Software and Hardware in Computer Labs and Classrooms Do you need new software installed or a version updated in a computer lab or instructor computer? Requests for changes must made by May 15 for the fall semester. Changes include, but are not limited to adding additional software, upgrading software, and installing new hardware (printers, desktops, laptops, AV systems, etc.). Requests should be sent to <u>helpdesk@lcsc.edu</u> by the deadline.
- Outdated Computer Equipment Turn-in: An important part of the LC State IT Security initiatives is to ensure all equipment used for LC State work is up-to-date, supportable, and serviceable. Therefore, all computers that are older than 72 months (six years) will be required to be taken out of inventory and turned over for surplus. (Your recent inventory form contains the purchase date for each computer.) Please follow the Surplus Property Disposal process found here and ensure you complete the Property Disposal Form found here before sending the computers to IT for clearing of data prior to removal of the equipment from campus.
- **Password Expiring Notification Email:** IT has implemented a system that will provide advanced notification of an @LCSC.EDU password expiration. Users will receive an email from helpdesk@lcsc.edu with the subject "LCSC.EDU Email Password Expiring Notice" within 21, 7, 3, 2, and 1 days of their @LCSC.EDU password expiring. You can see an example of this email here: www.lcsc.edu/media/12203/password-expiration.png. The email from IT will NOT ask you to click on a link to change your password. Instead, the email provides information about when your password expires, the requirements for a new password, and a brief explanation regarding how to change your password. You should never click on a link included in an email and provide your password.
