As promised, here are some highlights of a few individual and group achievements at LC State, this time with a heavy focus on natural science! Be proud of your accomplishments, your colleagues, and your college!

- LC State biology students Brayden Graves, Kyra Lockett, Kenedi Freeman, and Abbey Marler presented a poster on their research, "Deficiency of Blm DNA helicase during early embryonic cell cycles establishes detrimental outcomes in surviving progeny" at the 64th Annual Drosophila Research Conference in Chicago last month. Out of 222 undergraduate attendees, Graves was selected as one of eight undergraduate speakers to give a talk on this research during the "Spotlight on Undergraduate Research" workshop. Lockett was one of just 14 students to receive an award with other winners coming from much larger institutions such as Brown University, University of Michigan, University of North Carolina, and the University of California, Irvine.
- Dr. Rachel Jameton, professor of chemistry and newly named chair of the Physical, Life, Movement & Sport Sciences Division, was awarded a \$20,000 Out of School STEM Programming Grant for STEMGEM: an afterschool program and summer camp 2023 that focuses on mentoring between college and career scientists, and secondary school girls.
- Dr. Nancy Johnston, associate professor of chemistry, traveled with four undergraduate science
 majors to a national meeting in Chicago, American Geophysical Union, where they presented
 research on air pollution/emissions: "Characterization of Compost Emissions using GasChromatography Methods; Five-Year Study of Volatile Organic Compounds in an Intermountain
 West Valley Region; and Monitoring of Multiple Air Pollutants in a Rural Northwest Valley: NASA
 AERONET, EPA Fine Particulate Matter and Local Sulfur Species."
- **Dr. Lloyd Mataka**, associate professor of chemistry, published a new paper: Mataka, L. Saderholm, J. & Hodge T. (2022), "College STEM faculty teaching practices; the influence of a professional development with faculty learning communities." IT Updates:

- Computer Resource Allocation Consideration: As you plan to purchase computers for your department or division, either before the end of FY23 or at the beginning of FY24, please keep the following in mind. To best use LC State resources, as new computers are purchased, we are allotting only one computer per individual. If you purchase a new system, you must either turn in your existing computer(s) or, if appropriate, have the equipment assigned to another individual as their primary computer. LC State will not purchase or allocate two devices for a single individual. This applies to all computers, both desktops and mobile (such as laptops and Surface notebooks). This does not apply to devices classified as tablets or e-writers like iPads and reMarkables. Please contact Courtney Toth (cetoth@lcsc.edu) if you have any questions.
- Outdated Computer Equipment Turn-in: An important part of the LC State IT Security initiatives is to ensure all equipment used for LC State work is up-to-date, supportable, and serviceable. Therefore, all computers that are older than 72 months will be required to be taken out of inventory and turned over for surplus. (Your recent inventory form contains the purchase date for each computer.) Please follow the Surplus Property Disposal process found here and ensure you complete the Property Disposal Form found here before sending the computers to IT for clearing of data prior to the removal of the equipment from campus.
- Luma Training: All LC State employees will be transferring to the new State of Idaho Luma system on June 19. Luma is a cloud-based system replacing the current state system that houses I-Time, Employee Self-Service, W-2s, Pay Stubs, etc,. All employees are now able to access prerequisite training in Luma; the goal of the prerequisite training is to prepare and onboard all

State of Idaho employees to begin learning how to use Luma. Steps to set up your new account are outlined below. For questions and assistance email hr@lcsc.edu.

- Step 2: Access Luma Training to complete Prerequisite training materials.
 - To access Luma training, from the Enterprise Dashboard, please select the Luma Training tile.
- Step 3: Manually register for the course by typing "Pre" into the search bar:
