## **Monday Message**

Dear all,

I thought an update on our water woes would be timely. As you may recall, in May the college was granted permission from the City for an alternative watering schedule through the Avista NAIA World Series. This alternative plan allowed us to maintain a reduced watering schedule for three key areas (Harris Field, the multipurpose field across from Harris Field, and the President's Residence). The approved schedule cut our typical water usage by 30-60% across these locations and completely eliminated irrigation usage for main campus generally (hence the browning lawns).

In June we applied for and were granted the ability to use our reduced watering allotment more broadly by rotating locations. We are using the allotment to keep: (a) Harris Field functional for the summer American Legion baseball activities (This strategy imposes an overall reduction from what would be "normal" for Harris Field of about 30%; and as a result, the field is showing signs of water-restriction stress, but so far we are able to keep it basically alive); and (b) the grass roots and juvenile shrubs and trees from dying in at least some parts of our main campus lawns. Since the Series concluded, the President's Residence is being maintained by hand watering (just like every other water restricted residence).

We continue to work within allowed restriction guidelines to preserve our campus grounds. As a reminder, employees – **staff and faculty** – are invited to adopt a section of grass/shrubs to hand water. So far adoption hand watering is taking place at the President's Residence, some areas near the Williams Conference Center and Sac Hall, as well as Physical Plant; and, it's not too late! We likely have a few more weeks until irrigation water is available. So, if you are willing and able to help save our grounds please contact Angie McClain in Physical Plant (208-792-2247, <a href="mailto:plant@lcsc.edu">plant@lcsc.edu</a>). We're happy to provide hoses and very much appreciate the help folks can lend. We've also secured the use of some water trailers that will allow Physical Plant staff to hand water more deeply in areas that can be accessed from campus roadways.

Like all things LC, we are Warrioring-up in the face of this challenge and are incredibly appreciative of our Physical Plant staff and crew for their tireless and relentless work to preserve our grounds as best we can. Please give a shout-out of thanks when you see them.
