

- Office 365 License Upgrade: LC State has updated its annual subscription for its Microsoft Office licensing. The college now has access to almost all Microsoft services without purchasing additional licensing. The expanded licensing contains many new advanced security functions and additional software services. The newly available software services include Microsoft Power Automate, Microsoft Power BI Professional, Microsoft Project, Microsoft Teams Phone, and Microsoft Visio. In addition, through your "@lcsc.edu" email account, you can download Microsoft Office and load it on up to five personal devices.
- Attention full-time, benefit-eligible Employees Public Service Loan Forgiveness: You may
 qualify for a program offering forgiveness on remaining balances of federal loans. LC State is a
 qualified employer for the <u>Public Service Loan Forgiveness program</u> and the program is providing
 a waiver opportunity through October where borrowers may receive credit for payments that have
 been suspended or deferred, or may receive credit for past periods of payments. The Human

- Parking Permits: 2022-2023 parking permits are available and ready for purchase online at https://lewisclark.omnigo.one/CESIReportExec/opr. Annual permits cost \$75 and semester permits cost \$50. Permits will be available for pickup in the Public Safety office, MLH 110, during regular business hours. You may park on campus without a permit until Monday, Aug. 29.
 - New 30-Day Permit: The Department of Public Safety is now offering the option to purchase a 30-day parking permit for \$25. To purchase a 30-day parking permit, visit https://lewisclark.omnigo.one/CESIReportExec/opr/Main.aspx and select this option. Once registration is complete, you will receive an email with your permit, including the date of expiration. It is your responsibility to print the permit and place it on the driver's side dashboard. - Coronavirus: For the latest coronavirus updates and information visit www.lcsc.edu/coronavirus.
 Our web-based information has been updated to include infectious disease resource information broadly; and includes the Fall 2022 Outlook document recently sent to students and the campus community. Note: we plan to maintain a supply of N95/KN95 masks, as well as rapid tests throughout the fall semester. Additionally, on-campus vaccination/booster clinics have been scheduled through CHAS Health on Sept. 28 and Oct. 13.
 - Coronavirus Tests: The COVID-19 free test order program will be suspended beginning Friday, Sept. 2, because Congress hasn't approved additional funding to replenish the nation's stockpile of tests. Up to eight free tests can still be ordered between now and the suspension date. Tests can be ordered at www.covid.gov/tests.
