- Office 365 License Upgrade: LC State has updated its annual subscription for its Microsoft
  Office licensing. The college now has access to almost all Microsoft services without purchasing
  additional licensing. The expanded licensing contains many new advanced security functions and
  additional software services. The newly available software services include Microsoft Power

Automate, Microsoft Power BI Professional, Microsoft Project, Microsoft Teams Phone, and Microsoft Visio. In addition, through your "@lcsc.edu" email account, you can download Microsoft Office and load it on up to five personal devices.

- Attention full-time, benefit-eligible Employees Public Service Loan Forgiveness: You may
  qualify for a program offering forgiveness on remaining balances of federal loans. LC State is a
  qualified employer for the <u>Public Service Loan Forgiveness program</u> and the program is providing
  a waiver opportunity through October where borrowers may receive credit for payments that have
  been suspended or deferred, or may receive credit for past periods of payments. The Human
