Dear all,

I want to share some **shoutouts and information updates**. First, special thanks and congratulations to Dean Ober, Assistant Dean Nelson, Division Chair Weeks and the CTE staff and faculty for their work coordinating and hosting a terrific week of Workforce Development Council and CTE meetings and conference. The Workforce Development Council has been instrumental in making the Schweitzer Career & Technical Center equipment purchases possible, as well as a more recent grant award of over \$1M that is making renovations and equipment upgrades for Diesel, Collision Repair and Welding possible, along with the creation and launch of our new Allied Health Hub in the Mechanical Technical Building. The CTE Connect Conference brought together 200-plus CTE educators (K-12 through college) for three-plus days of innovation sharing, curricular and programming updates and forecasting for the future. LC State was proud to showcase its facilities, faculty, staff and students in hosting these two important events.

Student Accounts update: Located in Reid Hall, Student Accounts is part of our Warrior OneStop. In early September, our director of Student Accounts, Ms. Kirstin Jeppsen, accepted a position outside of higher education. For the fall, Ms. Laura Hughes, director of Financial Aid, has agreed to serve as the interim director of Student Accounts (in addition to her ongoing role as director of Financial Aid). During this time, working with IT and drawing on the expertise of the Student Accounts and Financial Aid staff, Laura will seek to identify processing efficiencies and opportunities to automate some of the more manual processes in Students Accounts. We anticipate launching a search for a new, permanent director later this semester.

Adult Learner services & supports: One of LC State's successes during last year's legislative session was to secure funding to support an expansion of our programs and services for adult learners. Along with the addition of our Adult Learning coordinator, Ms. Dovie Willey, expansion included funding for a fulltime mental health counselor. Recognizing that adult learners often need classes and services at nontraditional times (i.e., after 5 p.m. and on weekends), Student Counseling has established expanded appointment hours. Counseling appointments are now available 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday-Friday; AND 5-7 p.m. on Mondays and Thursdays; and from 10 a.m. to noon on Saturdays. Additionally, as we move more live classes into the evenings and weekends and realize a larger non-traditional student presence on campus, other services will be examining their capacities to extend hours and be present for what we know will be a growing part of our student body – the adult learner.
