Dear all,

LC State's educational offerings are truly comprehensive – from GED and Workforce Training, through Second Chance Pell prison education, certificates, associate, bachelor's and now graduate-level course work and programs. This range and scope is a point of pride and illustrative of the relevant and responsive education role we play in and for our community, our region, our state and beyond. With this in mind, I want to share a bit about the life-changing impact our Adult Learning Center (ALC) is making.

The ALC is grant funded under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title II Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA). The purpose of this grant is to provide adult education and literacy services to adults in Region 2 of Idaho. With origins dating back to 1969, the ALC is aligned with the CTE division, and provides basic skills education for adults 16 years and older who are not currently enrolled in high school. Ultimately, the goal of adult education is to prepare individuals with the skills and knowledge needed to succeed in postsecondary education and the workforce.

Our ALC services are available in Grangeville, Lewiston, Moscow, and Orofino. Grant funding allows us to provide GED preparation instruction FREE of charge (although the test itself, consisting of four sections, costs \$30/section), as well as to administer the GED test year-round. LC State is proud to offer these services and education supports, and we celebrate the 367 (and counting) successful GED graduates we have helped over the course of the last four-plus years. Sixty-eight of these graduates have taken some steps toward the enrollment process - meaning they applied for admission, and/or were admitted, and/or actually registered for college classes. And, while there are GED-associated recruiting restrictions we must comply with, operating within appropriate parameters, our admissions and financial aid staff are working closely with ALC staff to make sure that next-steps education information and access supports are available to these graduates; inclusive of a special invitation to visit campus and enjoy a complimentary meal.

Here's a shoutout of thanks to our Adult Learning Center, Admissions and Financial Aid staff. We appreciate all you do and the difference you make!
