- Provost Search: As announced in a <u>news release</u> on Friday, Dr. Fred Chilson has been named the provost/vice president for Academic Affairs after a national search. "It's my pleasure to welcome Dr. Fred Chilson to a permanent leadership position as provost/vice president for Academic Affairs," President Pemberton said. "Dr. Chilson rose to the top from among a strong and varied finalist pool. In particular, Dr. Chilson's solid background and expertise across the liberal arts and sciences, professional studies and career technical education, combined with an accomplished record of scholarly productivity and achievement, make him well-suited to provide academic leadership to and for LC State."
- Week of the Young Child: April 2-8 is the Week of the Young Child, a national event celebrating early learning, young children, their teachers, families, and communities. President Pemberton will present her official proclamation establishing LC State's participation in this annual event to the KinderCollege on Tuesday April 5, at 10:30 a.m. The KinderCollege will be participating in the week-long celebration by holding activities related to the daily themes including Music Monday, Tasty Tuesday, Work Together Wednesday, Artsy Thursday and Family Friday which will feature a documentary "No Small Matter," covering the importance of early childhood education at noon in Sam Glenn 222. Everyone is invited.
- Virtual Teacher Career Fair: LC State's Career Center has partnered with institutions throughout Idaho to host the first ever Statewide Virtual Teacher Career Fair, Friday, April 8, from 1-4 p.m. Students can register for this event through Handshake, then attend either one-on-one recruitment sessions or group informational sessions. IT Updates:

- Internet Explorer: Microsoft has announced it will retire Internet Explorer on June 15, 2022. Faculty or staff who are still using that browser should transition to a more modern tool such as Microsoft Edge, Google Chrome, or Mozilla Firefox. IT will be remotely disabling Internet Explorer starting April 13. If you or your department has a service that only works with Internet Explorer, please contact helpdesk@lcsc.edu for assistance.
- Restart Computers: A reminder from IT to restart your computer once a week to install
 pending updates from Microsoft and other software developers. Restarting provides a
 secure computing environment at LC State by ensuring that all patches are applied.
 Starting on April 6, computers that haven't been restarted in seven days will receive a
 message to restart.

- **CEC modeling** is underway in response to meetings and guidance provided last week from both the Idaho Division of Human Resources and the Division of Financial Management. Details will be shared as soon as there is an approved CEC distribution model. Stay tuned.
- Seeding Our Tomorrows: President Pemberton recently formed four groups within President's Council and charged them with reviewing specific sections of LC State's annual student survey with the goal of finding ways to better recruit, convert, retain, and serve students. The Dogwood Group looked at sections regarding demographics and presented some of its finding at the last Council meeting on March 21. Noteworthy items included:
 - 80% of survey takers were pursuing a bachelor's degree and it was noted that, despite some unemployment trends nationally, over 95% of LC State's graduates are successfully placed in jobs, graduate schools, military, or other areas.
 - 30% of survey takers were non-traditional students, a population that LC State serves well and will continue to focus on with prior learning assessment opportunities, online courses, and shortened eight-week courses.
 - o 25% of survey takers lived in LC State housing and expressed high satisfaction levels with safety and housing availability, however, some expressed a dissatisfaction with food variety and quality. While dissatisfaction with food is commonplace in higher ed, strategies were named and discussed that might help improve this area.
 - The top two concerns among survey takers were finances and balancing competing commitments. Automatic merit-based scholarships and financial aid services and strategies were reviewed and discussed.
 - o 75% of survey takers were female. It was noted that only 35% of LC State's student body is male and that this could represent an underserved population and area for potential enrollment growth.
