Recruitment, Conversion and Retention: This month is critical for our all-in efforts to make sure current/returning students register for summer/fall, and our strong pool of admitted students is converted into new registrations for fall. April 15 is the scholarship acceptance deadline for our academic merit-based awards (Presidents, Provosts and Deans scholarships, see: <u>www.lcsc.edu/financial-aid/types-of-aid/scholarships-and-waivers</u>). As of this message, over the past weeks I have personally have made 229 calls to prospective students being offered a <u>Presidential Scholarship</u>. - Seeding Our Tomorrows: President Pemberton recently formed four groups within President's Council and charged them with reviewing sections of LC State's annual student survey with the goal of finding ways to better recruit, convert, retain, and serve students. The Rose Group looked at sections regarding delivery methods, internet and devices used, and COVID-19. Noteworthy items included the following.
 - Only 47% of survey takers who attend face-to-face classes in Lewiston said they are comfortable taking classes online, while just 68% of those who attend online said they're comfortable taking classes face-to-face.
 - Action/takeaway: Some students prefer face-to-face, and some prefer online.
 Either way, what appears key is that students get what they sign up for in terms of the expected mode of course delivery.
 - 79% said their internet is fast enough for school-related needs; and 92% said a laptop is very useful for doing school work.
 - Action/takeaway: A continued focus on student technology needs (internet, laptops, etc.) is important, and perhaps even more information and training should be considered. An idea would be to provide incoming students with technology requirements for their classes and programs and to assist students with technology at orientation. Comprehensive course use of Canvas and student information/orientation associated with navigating Canvas are key.
 - 61% said they have been vaccinated, and 10% said they plan to be vaccinated. Interestingly, this aligns with our voluntarily disclosed employee vaccination rate of approximately 71%. Go, Warriors!
 - o 67% said their greatest concern with COVID-19 is its impact on the elderly.
