## Monday Message Feb. 1, 2021

**President's Message:** Dear all. With the Legislative Education Week behind us, I feel good about messaging LC State, and the quality work we do in service of our education mission and on behalf of our students. In case you missed it, here are a few excerpts from the JFAC testimony – be proud LC. Be proud!

"We are a small and efficient institution. We are Idaho's <u>only</u> four-year public small college, fully dedicated to teaching; providing education opportunities from GED and Workforce Training, to CTE, associate's and bachelor's degrees, and soon a graduate certificate in Nursing Management & Leadership – thanks to last year's legislative statute change and last month's unanimous program approval from the SBOE.

At LC State our employees wear many hats, and most offices are made up of just a few dedicated professionals who do the work of much larger staffs. We are small, but we are mighty, and we are proud of the service we provide to our students, and the role we play in support of Idaho's education and industry needs.

With enrollment that has remained relatively stable (although we do anticipate it will be down this spring, and probably into next fall); with 82 percent of our students being Idaho residents, 78 percent first generation, and nearly half Pell eligible (indicating high financial need); with our retention rate increasing over the past decade from 52 percent to over 60 percent, and with graduation rates steadily rising; as well as perhaps most importantly, our post-graduation placement rates increasing to 97 percent for "academic" grads and 98 percent for CTE (meaning a job/career, military or grad school within a year of graduation); along with the fact that 65 percent of LC State employed graduates stay in Idaho … We are delivering!"
