President's Message: Happy Monday all. Thank you for hanging in there with our altered spring 2021 calendar/schedule, as we work together to do all we can to minimize contagion transmission risk potential and opportunities (e.g., steadfastly working through the February holiday and moving spring break to the end of the semester. Please note: both of these changes are allowed per SBOE policy and were approved via SBOE consult prior to implementation). As has been my practice these past couple messages, below you will find further excerpts from our LC State January 2021 JFAC testimony; and, let me say yet again, be proud Warriors. Be proud.

Regarding **successes** ... LC State currently offers over 30 online degree or certificate programs, including many designed specifically for working adults as a part of our "LC Works for Working Adults" initiative – an initiative that will likely be increasingly timely and relevant as we move forward beyond the pandemic.

And ... we found out this past summer – based on a statewide online course/program survey, that LC State is Idaho's online <u>bachelor's degree</u> leader, providing **nearly half of the State's current total of 43 fully online bachelor's programs** (we currently have 20 fully online bachelor's degree programs). Additionally, we are partnering, collaborating and leveraging our collective statewide online offerings and strengths, in and through Online Idaho – our State's just-launched online marketplace and course, program, degree access portal.

We continue to outpace our targets in terms of bachelor's degree production, and are confident certificate and associate degree production will rebound with the opening and operation of the Schweitzer CTE Center. Overall, LC State has increased its degree production by 67 percent, since graduating 523 students a decade ago in 2010, and 873 students in 2020.

As to **challenges** ... while our grad rates have been improving, they are not yet where we want them to be. That said, schools and students are too often judged by arbitrary definitions of what is "on time" and what isn't. Yes, of course, we value, encourage and support swift completion of certificates and degrees; but given our student demographics (first gen, low income, 56 percent reporting that they are working at least 10 hours per week up to full-time, while also attending school), as long as the trend is improving, driven and supported by our ongoing commitment to the SBOE Complete College America initiative, and wraparound student advising and supports, I maintain that I and we **are proud to serve these students at whatever pace works for them.**

Lastly, I'd like to mention a **few highlights not reflected in the report**.

- In 2020 (despite the pandemic) our Workforce Training served nearly 3,000 students with a 95 percent successful course completion rate.
- Our SBDC served 420 clients for a total of over 2,000 consulting hours.
- Our Adult Learning Center helped 55 students complete their GED.
- And we served over 1,200 dual credit students from 20 different high schools.

I am proud of what we do; and I am proud of what we accomplish; and I thank you for this opportunity to shed light on some of our successes as well as our challenges; and know, in fact be assured, we have not been sitting idly, wringing our hands just waiting for the pandemic to be over. We have been active. We have been engaged. And we, LC State, continue to deliver.

P.S. Reminder to refer to our <u>Inclement Weather guidelines</u>. With 100 percent class use of our Canvas LMS and various technology upgrades, remote instruction (if needed) should be relatively seamless. Stay safe all. C
