A fiercely contested, wonderfully intense LC State women's basketball NAIA Round 16 game against Campbellsville University (KY). The Warrior women did not prevail, but played with heart and determination to and through the final minutes of the game.

This week's campus song played over the noon hour on the Harris Field speakers (Cat Stevens, "Wild World").

We concluded a meaningful and memorable **34th annual Native American Awareness Week**, with closing ceremonies recognizing and honoring LC alum the Rev. Dr. Mary Jane Miles as the Lifetime Achievement Awardee, followed by our Native American Club scholarship raffle finale.

LC State nursing faculty and students shared their time and expertise conducting hundreds of midnasal swab COVID-19 tests for students and employees – as we continue to engage surveillance testing to help keep our campus community safe and thriving. [Update: We've received results from Friday's tests and so far 187 out of 187 have come back negative! Way to go, Warriors!].

The afternoon progressed with the No. 4 ranked Warrior men's basketball team defeating Oklahoma Wesleyan to advance to the NAIA quarterfinals. [Update: they won again on Saturday and play in the semifinals tonight at 6 p.m., PDT!].

Led by a dozen indoor track and field All-Americans, our women's and men's track and field teams broke records and qualified for outdoor nationals at a meet in Spokane; our No. 24 ranked men's tennis team opened a weekend of tune-up exhibition play against teams from the Community Colleges of Spokane; volleyball played strong against Corban on the road; and baseball took down the College of Idaho Yotes.

Closer to home, student health and wellness offered on-campus stress reduction workshops and presentations to help students navigate the semester midpoint.

So, **lest you think that the full college experience isn't happening, think again.** We may be living through and with challenging circumstances, but Warriors are indomitable. Warriors don't passively endure, they find a way forward. Warriors stay strong. Which is exactly what we have been, are, and will keep doing.
