President's Message

Dear all,

On April 1st, the Idaho Freedom Foundation (IFF) attacked LC State. They posted an article rife with hyperbolic distortions and acerbic falsehoods. They also posted a picture of a student to accompany the article without the student's knowledge or consent.

An attempt to disparage the good work of our faculty, staff, and by extension our community partners and alums, can and will be met with correction and clarification (read below as I address some of the article's assertions). Using and abusing our students, however, is a line crossed. Within hours of becoming aware of the photo we contacted the IFF and the picture was removed from their website, with an assurance that it would be removed from their social media postings (as of this sending it appears that the photo has been removed from their various platforms).

We are a civil society, and I say to all of us – our campus community, our broader community, our alumni, our business and industry partners and friends, and our legislators, let us hold each other accountable for acting like it. And, as to LC State and what we are actually doing. What we are actually about... read on...

Diversity, inclusion, equity... We are committed to serving our education Mission, effectively helping ALL our students become *successful leaders*, *engaged citizens and lifelong learners*. We do not shy away from words. We value diversity (the condition of having or being composed of differing elements), inclusion (the action or state of including or being included), and equity (the quality of being fair and impartial).

Educationally, under the state of Idaho general education umbrella, our LC State general education framework includes <u>diversity and cultural sensitivity</u>. Students select one course from among a menu of over 20 options (including World History, US History, Comparative Government, Spanish and Nez Perce Language, as well as Ethics and Identity, Diversity in Organizations and Social-Cultural Aspects of Sports, to name a few). Do we mandate a particular course? No, we do not.

Do we have a Center for Teaching & Learning (CTL)? Yes, we do. It was established in 2014 by former LC State president Tony Fernandez. The CTL "... supports the personal and intellectual growth of faculty in the pursuit of teaching excellence, inclusive practices, service and professional development." It is, to paraphrase a recent presentation, a place for learning and support, a center for conversation and community, and ultimately a resource to help us better serve our students — all our students. These are good things. Do the CTL resources include "samples" of syllabus statements? Yes, they do. Samples that "...can be adopted and adapted to best suit the purposes of an individual instructor and/or course" (www.lcsc.edu/teaching-learning/inclusion-diversity-equity-antiracism/guides-and-resources/syllabus-statements). Do we mandate sample use? No, we do not.

So, in response to the assertions levied in the IFF's attack, let me be completely clear. We're about education. We're about connecting college to career and learning to earning. We're about options and opportunities. We're about today and tomorrows yet to be imagined. To do these things, and do them well, we must be equitable; we must value difference; and we must continue to work to expand educational access and foster a welcoming campus culture of inclusion so that ALL our students are empowered to succeed.

- Recruitment at LC State: The Admissions Office will be offering four segments in upcoming Monday Messages about recruitment and enrollment. Last week an Enrollment Funnel guide was shared to show the stages a prospective student navigates before reaching an enrollment decision. At the top of the funnel is the prospect/inquiry stage where the student is thinking about college and inquiring about LC State. During this stage, the Admissions Office will participate in a number of activities to widen this portion of the funnel. Here are a few examples:
 - High School/Community College Visits: This includes both classroom and counseling/advising center visits.
 - Fairs: These are sponsored by high schools, community colleges, employers (e.g., Schweitzer Engineering), or national/regional organizations (NACAC, PNACAC, etc).
 - o Campus Visits: Students can schedule an individual visit or attend a preview event (e.g., Warrior Discovery Day).
 - ACT/SAT/pre-ACT/PSAT: We purchase names by majors and within certain test score ranges for scholarship purposes.
 - RaiseMe: This platform allows students to explores colleges and enter their achievements to earn micro-scholarships.
 - Direct Admission: This is an Idaho State Board of Education initiative that pre-admits students to either six or eight colleges/universities. We receive a list of these students to start marketing LC State opportunities.
- Week of Giving: Warrior Athletics is gearing up to launch its Warriors Week of Giving, April 5-11.
