President's Message

Dear all,

At Lewis-Clark State College we know individualized interpersonal interaction between the instructor and student is vital, we know connecting learning to life is the core of the educational experience we provide, and we know our small, warm, and friendly campus is a big reason why students choose, stay, and succeed at LC State. With this in mind, and given the recent surge of the coronavirus delta variant, I want to make clear that while we are fully committed to maintaining an on-campus and in-person learning experience this fall, we are equally committed to our collective and community health and safety. I've heard our students. I've heard our faculty and staff. We want to be together, and we want to deliver and experience transformative education.

Yes, the coronavirus delta variant is another formidable challenge, but the good news is that Warriors are accustomed to meeting and overcoming challenges. We kept our doors open and in-person classes rolling throughout the 20-21 academic year (when many others closed), and we expect to achieve the same thing this year. To do so, it will again take perseverance, creativity, care for one another, communication, and teamwork.

Our Coronavirus Tactical Team, led by Senior Vice President/Vice President for Student Affairs Andy Hanson, is convening regularly and developing proactive strategies to help us launch and maintain the academic year as safely and responsibly as possible. After consultation with representatives from the Governor's Office, the state's Division of Human Resources, the Department of Health and Welfare, the Office of the State Board of Education (OSBE), the State Board of Education (SBOE), and our own Public Health - Idaho North Central District, key elements of our strategy will be:

- An updated operations matrix inclusive of indoor space masking requirements to be finalized and posted on our <u>coronavirus resource page</u> before the end of the week. Which means, masking will happen dependent upon CDC guidance, state, and local Public Health recommendations, SBOE input, and campus and community vaccination and infection metrics.
- Weekly campus-wide COVID-19 surveillance testing of students and employees. Such tests, conducted as we bring folks onto campus and launch the semester, will help us gauge infection levels and inform decisions for success this fall. Note: Our plan/strategy has been vetted with the state and is not contrary to the Governor's executive order.

Here's how weekly testing will work: Test kits (VAULT testing kits) supplied by the State of Idaho Department of Health and Welfare will be distributed to students and employees (at no cost to them) beginning the week of Aug. 23; with **surveillance testing** continuing throughout **at least** the first 4-6 weeks of the semester. These quick and easy **saliva tests** can be self-administered with the results reported to the individual and Idaho Public Health.

Those who have been fully vaccinated or infected in the last 60 days will be able to opt-out of testing, if they so choose, by providing verification. Dual credit students and others who are not taking live or hybrid classes on campus or in Coeur d'Alene, people who have religious or medical exemptions, and people who have had their first vaccination dose within three weeks of the testing date will also be able to opt out. Details will be provided and disseminated via email and our coronavirus resource page in the coming days as we make arrangements for campus-based testing sites set up weekly to help support folks as they get a feel for the routine of the saliva-based test protocol; multiple test drop-off sites; and finalize opt-out verification submission logistics.

I want to remind everyone that our best path for success and safety is to get vaccinated. Beginning this Friday, as you can see in the events section below, Public Health will be holding a vaccination clinic on campus on Aug. 13 (<u>register here</u>), with additional weekly on-campus clinics scheduled with both Public Health and CHAS Health. A full schedule is posted to our <u>coronavirus resource page</u>. We are doing all we can to make vaccination convenient and accessible.

If you haven't been vaccinated already, I simply cannot stress enough how important it is that you do so. Simply put, the virus will spread and mutate as long as there are viable hosts. The pressure on our local, regional, state and national healthcare system is escalating – which means not only are we closing in on resource limits for COVID-related healthcare, but reducing resource availability for all other healthcare needs. As a further incentive, students who provide proof of vaccination (not later than Oct. 1, 2021) will have \$100 "Warrior Bucks" loaded onto their Warrior ID cards, and will be entered into a drawing to receive one of two in-state tuition scholarships awarded for the spring semester. More details are forthcoming on this as well.

I thank you all for your continued commitment to LC State, each other, and the success of our students.

Stay tuned and stay strong, Warriors.
