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## **President's Message**

Dear all,

Friday (Aug. 13) was a big day! I stopped by HR and verified my vaccination status by showing my vaccination card, and then took the Vault test to give the process a try. I wanted personal experience with what I am expecting us to do. For the Vault test, you need a computer and access to zoom. It took about 5-7 minutes to create the first-time user account (instructions are in the test kits). I then logged in to Zoom; and waited maybe five minutes in a Vault Test waiting room. The room host, my Vault test coach, admitted me, asked to see a photo ID, and then patiently walked me through the saliva collection process, tube sealing and even packaging steps. It was a well-guided process. I felt supported and was able to ask questions. Because I had been especially ardent in making sure not to eat or drink 30 minutes prior to testing (head's up – this is an important part of the pre-test prep), it took a bit of time for me to muster up sufficient saliva. A tip my Vault coach suggested is that it can be helpful to drink water earlier, before the 30 minute no eat or drink window, so that you can more readily produce saliva. That's about it. Results will come to me via email. If it turns out I am COVID-19 positive (I suspect not, as I am not symptomatic and have been following safety protocols and CDC guidance, but, as we know per ongoing research and science, breakthrough infections can occur and may not present with symptoms among vaccinated individuals), I will of course follow the infection response protocol as described on our Coronavirus Resource Page.

And, just in case you missed it...

Our updated <u>Operational Levels Matrix</u> is posted on our <u>Coronavirus Resource Page</u>. The matrix and associated metrics along with ongoing consultation with Public Health; state agency, sister-institution and SBOE meetings, input and directives; CDC guidelines and **ongoing vaccination and infection rate data**; will guide our path forward into fall. And so, in response to the various metrics and inputs reviewed, and consistent with news shared earlier by our Idaho sister institutions, in addition to **launching our campus-wide weekly surveillance testing strategy** (details are posted on the Coronavirus Resource Page) **LC State will institute an interior space masking requirement** (regardless of vaccination status) **effective Monday**, **Aug. 16**, and **continuing at least through the post-holiday weekend infection window (Friday, Sept. 17)**.

It remains my hope and intention that our weekly surveillance testing strategy and potential for increased campus-community vaccinations (see the vaccination clinic schedule located on our <u>Coronavirus</u> <u>Resource Page</u>) will help us create and maintain a safe on-campus/in-person experience and environment, ideally allowing us to be mask-optional as we move further into fall. To further facilitate our health and safety efforts, ventilation and filtration modifications have been put in place to meet CDC recommendation parameters for interior spaces; and while pivot-ready should not be disregarded our expectation and plan is to operate a normal academic calendar in terms of breaks, finals, etc.; with normal or near-normal space capacities (e.g., there may be some capacity modifications associated with athletic venues, as an example).

Folks may opt-out of weekly surveillance testing by meeting the opt-out criteria (i.e., verifying full vaccination status or submission and acceptance of a qualified medical or religious exemption). Employees will coordinate opt-out verification and/or exemption requests with HR. Students will do the same as described in the information posted on our <u>Coronavirus Resource Page</u>.

Our safety protocols associated with usage of the COVID-19 Reporting Line (208-792-2002), contact tracing (we are looking for volunteers to help with this effort – please contact Student Affairs to help), isolation and quarantine requirements, as well as the expectation to stay home if you feel ill, remain norms of operation as long as the pandemic persists. For employees, be aware that unlike last year (at least at this time) there are no special COVID-19 leave codes. Employees who are ill will code and use leave via normal policies and practice.

Live/in-person work, teaching and learning are the central tenants and operational expectations of and for LC State. Without doubt we are and will confront pandemic-related challenges. We can do this. Stay strong, Warriors.
