  current risk level is: Moderate.
  - Cases Update: Currently there are 6 active cases and 1 student in isolation in campus housing.
  - Reporting Line: If someone believes they were exposed to someone with an active case of COVID-19 or believes they are infected themselves, they should contact the campus COVID-19 Reporting Line at 208-792-2002 for guidance.

  - Continuing Weekly Testing: LC State will plan to continue its weekly surveillance testing program through the fall semester (assuming the state supply of tests continues to be available), and is working to implement onboarding testing during the month of January for the spring semester.
  - Vault Tests Accuracy: The Vault Test is a saliva-based, RT-qPCR test that detects specific genes from the SARS-CoV-2 virus the virus that causes COVID-19. The test is very sensitive to the presence of SARS-CoV-2, with 98% of tests providing either a positive or negative result. The test can detect fewer than 10 copies of viral genes per milliliter of saliva and can detect the virus within two days of infection. Because it tests specific to SARS-CoV-2, it does not test for the flu.
  - Staff/Offices Tasked with Distributing Masks: The college has a limited supply of masks to provide when people forget or otherwise need them, but these are primarily intended for campus guests who were not aware of the campus mask policy before coming to campus. Offices that are distributing face masks should be mindful of this and monitor how often an individual student is coming in to get a one-time use face mask. Individual judgment about distributing a mask to current students more than once will be respected but it is perfectly acceptable to send a student back to their vehicle, apartment, or dorm room to retrieve their own masks if they make repeated requests.
- **Student Survey:** Students have been sent the annual Student Survey. Please encourage students to respond. Responses will help us better support and serve our students. The survey will close Monday, Oct. 11, at 5 p.m. Results of the last annual all student survey can be found on the <u>intranet</u>.
- NWCCU Midcycle Review: In August, LC State submitted its NWCCU (regional accreditation) Midcycle Report. An evaluation of our status towards Mission Fulfillment by representatives of NWCCU will take place in October. An important part of that review is an institutional self-review of student achievement using comparative peer data and disaggregating by institutionally meaningful categories of students (e.g., race/ethnicity, gender, first generation status and socioeconomic status). If you want to learn more about what was found during this institutional self-reflection, join us at the PDT scheduled for Sept. 27, at 3:30-4:30 p.m. Drs. Fred Chilson, interim vice president of Academic Affairs, and Grace Anderson, director of Institutional Research & Effectiveness, will share what was found in anticipation of the NWCCU review scheduled to take place on Oct 11-12.
