- **Coronavirus Updates & Risk Level:** For the latest coronavirus updates and information visit <u>www.lcsc.edu/coronavirus</u>. The page will continue to be updated with resources and FAQs. In accordance with its <u>Operational Levels</u>, LC State's current risk level is: Moderate.

- **Phone Outage:** The campus phone system will be upgraded this week. This upgrade requires a phone system outage on Friday, Dec. 4, from 5:30 p.m. to approximately 9:30 p.m. During this outage, you will be unable to make or receive phone calls on your desk phone or your softphone, and incoming callers will be unable to leave you voicemails.

- Unit Assessment Report (UAR) and Resource Request Form (RRF):
  - UARs: Units will continue to engage in their usual assessment and quality improvement practices, however, no UARs will be submitted to Institutional Research & Effectiveness (IR&E) for posting. Instructional Programs will update UAR forms with current program learning outcomes, in preparation for the 2021-2022 assessment cycle and NWCCU midcycle review in fall 2021.
  - Program Performance: Instructional Programs are crafting work plans aligned with the recent program performance initiative. Non-instructional Programs will engage in the performance review process in early spring 2021.
  - RRFs: The RRF template and directions are posted to the IR&E Intranet site (<u>http://intranet.lcsc.edu/ir/IRintranet/ASSESS\_FY21.html</u>) and are due to the next level supervisor and IR&E on Dec. 8.
  - The Functional Area Committees (FACs) will review the RRF requests in January-February and chairs from each constituent group will meet with President's Cabinet to make resource recommendations reflecting the priorities of their respective group.
