## Native Idaho

Nimipuutímtki – in the Nez Perce Language

There are five federally recognized Indian tribes in Idaho – the Shoshone-Bannock, the Shoshone-Paiute, the Coeur d'Alene, the Kootenai, and the Nez Perce. The Nez Perce reservation consists of 750,000 acres, located east of Lewiston, Idaho.

The Nez Perce are centrally located in the region and have their own names for their neighbors. The Nez Perce call themselves **Niimíipuu** – the people. Their names for the other Native people in Idaho are...

- Kúuspel'uu Kutenai
- 'iskíicu'mix Coeur d'Alene
- Séelix Salish
- Hey'úuxcpel'uu Northern Paiute
- Pelúucpuu Paloos
- Tiwélqe Shoshone-Bannock

Ta'c léeheyn - good day Ta'c méeywi – good morning Ta'c haláxp – good afternoon Ta'c kuléewit – good evening

'eehé – yes Wéet'u – no Qe'ciyew'yew' – thank you

**Qo'c 'ee hexnú'** – See you later (to 1 person) **Qo'c 'eetx hexnú'** – See you later (to plural)

'iin wees \_\_\_\_\_. – I am <u>(your name)</u>.
