Dear all,

This message is about appreciation and giving thanks.

First – Priority registration was last week. In the end, our headcount was 1,743, which is 6% above last year. I want to **thank** the instructional divisions, the Advising Center, Registrar/Records, and all of the other campus departments who found creative ways to encourage students to get registered and lock in their schedules for spring 2024. Here are some examples:

- Social Sciences, Humanities, and Nursing & Health Sciences each held "pizza socials" inviting students to gather with faculty, socialize, and receive advising.
- PLMSS gave away swag to students that registered for classes last week.
- T&I hosted a "dough nut" forget event last Thursday.
- Teacher Education & Mathematics gave away goodie bags to students who completed registration.
- The Advising Center and Registrar/Records collaborated to distribute stickers saying, "Hello I am Registered."

In addition, students have been reminded via Canvas, yard signs, the Pathfinder, and, above all, direct communication between advisors and advisees. Great effort by all! The creative energy and interpersonal engagement poured into promoting priority registration is exactly what we're about. **Thank you**. Well done. And, let's keep it going - we have some current and incoming students who need spring 2024 schedules.

Second - I want to give a **shoutout of appreciation** to Student Involvement and various participating departments for orchestrating our second annual "Grad-fest" program last Tuesday. Grad-Fest creates a one-stop shop for students to attend to the various logistics associated with graduation, and was a terrific success!

Third – Last week, Ms. Dovie Wiley (Adult & Corrections Education) helped coordinate a facility tour and casual visit with our LC State students in the Idaho Correctional Institution. All three deans (Drs. Maddy, Ober and Mr. Gibbs), our director of College Advancement/executive director of the LCSC Foundation (Ms. Jennie Jones Hall) and our assistant director of Development & Alumni Engagement (Ms. Allison Silvestri) attended with me, and, it was nothing short of terrific.

In fact, with his permission, read on for excerpts of **praise** shared by Dean Gibbs upon his return to campus. "...[M]any students approached...to share how much they love their classes...They gave...very high praise and asked...[that we pass] their words along...[We] heard things like 'best class I've ever taken' and 'the most amazing teacher' and 'you can tell that she really cares about us.' At one point, two students were speaking...about their gen ed course and explaining how amazing the instructor was. Their explanation evoked an image of an instructor patiently and passionately teaching students in a classroom. It wasn't until the end of our discussion that they revealed the class was being taught online (asynchronously) using Canvas. It blew my mind that these students had forged such a personal connection with their instructor in this format...Several students spoke of the summer writing workshops. They talked about how it has inspired them to keep diaries and write about their experiences and their hopes of sharing and publishing. It [was] clear...that these students aren't just learning from the content and structure...built into...courses. They are also deeply affected by [our faculty's] personalities and approaches to teaching."

I echo Dean Gibbs' comments and share his sentiments. It was truly one of our proudest days. **We applaud and most sincerely appreciate** all who have been part of making this life-changing education opportunity possible.

- ADA Upgrades: K&G Construction is on campus the next several months carrying out the work
 for the campuswide ADA accessibility upgrades project. K&G just completed a new exterior entry
 ramp at the Living Learning Community building, next on its schedule are restrooms in the Admin
 Building. K&G is starting demolition of the basement men's restroom and the work will take
 approximately four-six weeks to complete. During this time, this restroom will be closed, and we

- Annual UAR & RRF: It's the season for annual Unit Assessment Reports (UAR) and Resource Request Forms (RRF) for FY25. As usual, any resource requests should be tied to program assessment (i.e., measurable program outcomes & self-sustainability), the college's Mission and Strategic Plan as well as the Presidential Priorities of enrollment and retention, and streamlining operations. Unit assessment (in coordination with supervisor) and resource request documents should be prepared by program directors and academic chairs and submitted for supervisor review by Dec. 1, 2023. Unit Assessment Reports are to be submitted at least every three years, on a rotation determined by the unit, so please consult with your supervisor. Then these documents will be posted to our campus-wide program assessment website, and Functional Area Committees (FACs) chaired by the area Vice Presidents or designee(s) will review Resource Request Forms between January-February to discuss and prioritize items. Emergent priorities will

This work was begun Oct. 17 and is expected to be completed by Feb. 5, 2024. Content is expected to be migrated to the new
