- Mileage Rate: The Idaho State Board of Examiners has approved an increase to the Idaho State mileage rate from 65.5 to 67.0 cents a mile, to be effective starting Feb. 1, to match the federal rate.

- Peer Mentor Applications: The First Year Experience Program is currently seeking peer mentor recommendations for the fall 2024 semester. A peer mentor is a current student who has successfully completed at least one semester at LC and helps new freshmen build a foundation for personal success at LC State. Peer mentors are friendly, reliable, supportive, and are able to demonstrate leadership qualities inside and outside the classroom. Mentors serve roughly 25 mentees 5-6 hours a week during orientation class, support programs (Orientation Day, Discovery Day, Homecoming, study nights, etc.), outreach and in-person meetings. - Retirement Plan Changes: The Idaho State Board of Education Retirement Plan Committee has recently completed a multi-year, comprehensive review of the Idaho Optional Retirement Plan (ORP). ORP is comprised of TIAA-CREF and Corebridge (Valic). As a result of that plan review, it was recommended and approved at the Dec. 13, 2023, State Board of Education meeting, that Fidelity will become the sole provider of the administrative services for the ORP effective in December 2024. More information will be provided by the Office of the State Board of Education as we transition, along with important dates, next steps, and other relevant details. A set of frequently asked questions has been posted to the <u>State Board of Education website</u>. These FAQs will be updated throughout this transition. Additionally, it is anticipated that all faculty and staff enrolled in either TIAA-CREF or Corebridge (Valic) will receive a direct communication coordinated by the Idaho State Board of Education regarding this change towards the end of January. We will provide additional information as it is received. In the meantime, please contact HRS with any questions.
- Sodexo and Jitterz are Open: Sodexo Food Service will temporarily serve food in the WCC while SUB/CSL building repair is underway. Additional seating is available in the SUB/CSL. Jitterz Coffee shop, game rooms, solarium seating, and campus bookstore are available for use in the lower level of the SUB/CSL. All building services (FYE, Career & Employment Services, Information Desk/Campus Card Services) have been temporarily relocated/condensed to the upper level area that was not affected.
