 - **April 15 – Nichols Monument Celebration** – In 2000, the Nichols family, a family with very deep roots in the LC Valley including multiple generations of graduates from LC State, made 305 acres of property available to the Lewiston School District, City of Lewiston, and Lewis-Clark State College. Today, this property is the location of Lewiston High School, Lewiston Community Park, and the Schweitzer Career & Technical Education Center. To celebrate and memorialize this history and generosity, LC State has been proud to partner with the school and city to create the Nichols Monument, located at the corner of Cecil Andrus Way and Bengal Way. This monument will be unveiled on Tuesday, April 15, at 3 p.m. at a celebration open to the public. We invite the LC State community to attend as an expression of the institution's gratitude.
