Today's Tech Byte: Group "My Courses" by Term



Tired of seeing a massive list of courses in your "My Courses" list in Blackboard? Click the "Gear" that pops up when you hover over "My Courses" or "Course List." Then check the box "Group by Term." You can also

reorder the terms in the list by dragging and dropping the current term to the top of the list. Click and drag the double-ended arrow that appears to the left of a term name to move it.

LCSC in the Market for New Online Course System

This spring, e-Learning Services submitted a request for proposals (RFP) for a new learning management system (LMS). The RFP closes at the end of January, at which point a review team of LCSC faculty and staff will evaluate proposals and select the best candidates. These candidates will be invited to campus to demonstrate their products.

Vendor demos will happen in late February or early March. All staff, faculty, and students are encouraged to attend. After the demos, the review team will use campus feedback and a statemandated rubric to evaluate and select the LMS best suited to meet LCSC's needs.

This decision came in the wake of a year-long review of LCSC's current LMS, Blackboard, and comparable products (Canvas, Schoology, and Brightspace).
