- Courses used to fulfill specific general education core requirements cannot be double-counted to fulfill LCSC program requirements.
- Semester credits are displayed in the LC Express plan. Quarter credits are converted to semester credits by multiplying the quarter credits by .67.
- 32 Residency (LCSC) credits required for graduation/36 must be upper division.
- The "X" in the LCSC column indicates the class was likely transferred if student chose WWCC elective.

At WWCC a minimum grade of "C-" is required for Gen Ed courses and a minimum 2.0 GPA is required to qualify for Associate's Degree.
