Announcements

- **CAH Volunteers:** Due to a staffing shortage, the Center for Arts & History (CAH) is looking for volunteers from campus and/or the community to help staff the Center. Coverage is needed from Tuesday-Friday from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. No experience required. - Cybersecurity Training: The Idaho 2025 annual Cybersecurity Training campaign launched on March 1 in Luma and must be completed by today, March 31. Administered by the Idaho Office of Information Technology Services, this year's training covers Artificial Intelligence (10 mins), Data Privacy (10 mins), and Security Awareness (15 mins), totaling approximately 35 minutes. Training modules can be accessed in Luma by clicking on "Luma Training" when you first log in, which will take you to the Employee Learning and Development profile.
- Independent Contractors: The Independent Contractor Payments (ICPs) process will be updated beginning April 7. ICPs no longer require the Independent Contractor Request form. Instead, you will enter ICPs just like all other non-catalog Requisitions, but using the object code 55199 (Independent Contractor Services). For step-by-step instructions, refer to the "How to Enter a Requisition for an ICP" guide available on the Jaggaer Resource page. To ensure proper payment processing, all ICPs must include supporting documentation, including but not limited to invoices and/or contracts. An independent contractor is an individual or entity that provides services under the terms of a contract and is not classified as an employee. It is important to make the determination between paying an individual as an employee vs. an independent contractor to ensure compliance with appropriate labor laws. Refer to the Controller's Independent Contractor page for more information. Additionally, all Jaggaer Requisitions using object codes 55150 (Services) and 55199 (Independent Contractor Services) will automatically route to Accounts Payable (AP) for review. - **Student/Adjunct Workers:** As the end of the semester approaches, please be sure to submit Personnel Record Cards or Personnel Action Forms to remove your student workers and adjunct faculty from payroll and Colleague. It's important that we properly terminate from our systems any

- employees who will no longer be working in your department. You can find these forms on the <u>HR</u> <u>Forms page</u>. If you have any questions, contact HRS. Please also remember to turn in any issued keys to Public Safety.
- Volunteer for Art Under the Elms: Art Under the Elms will be held April 18-20 and volunteers
