#### Timeline:

- 20 legislators signed a letter stating that Boise State was "wasting money" on diversity and social justice programming
- Boise State has been the focal point of many legislators who want spending on these programs to change/end (other institutions have also been named, but Boise State has taken the primary focus)
- Primary responses to these legislators have been attempts to explain how the programs benefit student education/success
- Ultimately, the legislators passed a vote to remove money from Boise State's budget in response
- However, the legislators want tuition to remain frozen/stable across the board, so the legislators chose to give this money from Boise State to LC State to guarantee LC State would freeze tuition
  - This is because the legislators knew that LC State needed a certain amount of money to be safe in freezing tuition
  - o LC State was not involved in how this decision took place.

#### Response:

- LC State does not have information on how the Idaho State legislators intend to vote or influence budgets for the schools until votes are finalized
- LC State wants to support diversity programs, but must accept the money that is given to them, whether they asked for it or not
- Delaying the letter from last week was due to the following motivation:
  - There was significant concern and uncertainty over what JFAC planned to do with fee programing in higher institutions, but it is no longer an issue.
  - However, there is now intent language in the bills that have been passed that target diversity and social justice programs
- It is unclear how the Idaho State legislators define such programs, so LC State and other institutions will need to collect data on what is being spent on all programs and how they are being defined
- Idaho State wants all the institutions across the board to have the same names for programing
  - In theory, this will allow them to target diversity programs effectively and remove budgets for such programs
- "We are looking forward to discussions with our Idaho State Board of Education on how student fees are used.... Etc."

#### Senator Hill:

Regarding the Provost's decision about allowing programs to continue through Spring Break: What happens if a student has already made prior plans to go home during spring break?

 Answer: Students in this situation should ask faculty about their flexibility during Spring Break, however if that doesn't work the students should go to the Dean of their programs to get further information on next steps.
