- **1. Most small businesses** are unlikely to obtain a grant. The exception could be a non-profit. Other exceptions are listed below.

- **2. Agriculture:** For agriculture, there is the opportunity for research or a Value-Added Producer Grant ("USDA-VAPG").

- **3. Exporting:** "The goals of STEP [State Trade Expansion Program] are to increase the number of small businesses that export, increase the value of exports and increase the number of small businesses exploring significant new trade opportunities."

- **4. People with Disabilities:** "Vocational Rehabilitation ("VR") is a state-federal program whose goal is to assist people with disabilities prepare for, secure, retain or regain employment." Typically, VR provides training or equipment.
