At a Glance

The At a Glance information provides a quick overview of progress the student has made toward earning their degree.

- * The current cumulative GPA along with a notation () of the minimum GPA required for the degree to be awarded. The type of degree, declared major, division, and catalog year.
- * On the right side, are two color coded bars giving an indication of the following requirements.

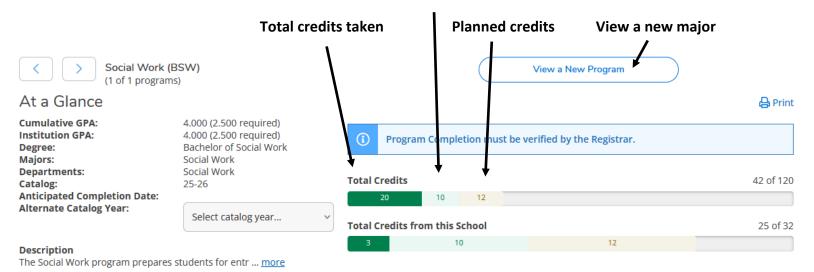
Green bar: represents the number of credits *completed*. Note that completed courses numbered lower than 100 (i.e. MATH 015, 023, 025, 040) are included here, but **do not count** toward graduation.

Light green bar: credit hours for which the student is actively registered.

Light yellow bar: credit hours planned for future semesters but for which student is not yet registered.

Requirements

• Requirements, provides detail about the specific courses required for the chosen degree program. This will typically be broken into smaller categories. For example, the requirements for bachelor's degree may be broken into several broad categories, such as General Education Core Requirements, Major Requirements, Emphasis Requirements, Minor Requirements and Electives.

Within each category, completion status for each specific requirement, as well as for the course(s) within that requirement, are coded by color (i.e. red for not started, gold for planned, and green for in-progress or completed).

Additional Sections: After Requirements, Progress shows additional areas that can be used to determine degree readiness.

<u>36 Upper Division Credits</u>—Progress for students seeking a bachelor's degree will contain a section which lists advancement toward the 36 credit upper division requirement. Note that credits in this sections are found elsewhere in Progress, so should not be counted as *additional* completed credit toward the degree requirements.

<u>Lab Science Requirement</u>—Bachelor degree candidates will include a lab science check to confirm completion. Note that credits in this sections are found elsewhere in Progress, so should not be counted as *additional* completed credit toward the degree requirements. See example below:

<u>Total Credits</u>—Depending upon the major and degree, this section provides a complete list of courses and credit totals (examples: 60 credits for Associate of Applied Science Degree; 64 credits for Associate's Degree; 120 Credits Required for Bachelor's Degree). Note that this section merely provides a *count* of credits. It does not take into consideration how or which credits apply to the degree requirements in the student's chosen major.

<u>Other Courses</u>—This section displays courses that do not meet a specific program requirement but can still count toward general electives, if needed. Note that courses numbered 099 and below do not count toward graduation.
