Syllabi in Summer Courses

The 2025 summer semester begins May 19th. Please make sure you syllabi are posted and visible before students gain access to summer courses the morning of Friday, May 16th. The syllabus should be accessible under the 'Syllabus' tab in your Canvas course.

For summer courses, faculty have the option to use the Syllabus template found on the Academic Affairs <u>Information for Faculty page</u>, under the 'Syllabus Resources' section. It is not required for faculty to use until fall 2025 semester, but it is available if you choose to utilize the template for the summer semester.


New Quizzes Import Button in Canvas

With the spring semester coming to a close, it is a great time to try out a new tool in Canvas as you begin preparing for your fall courses. Canvas has recently added a new feature when you import course content.

Fast-track the migration process of turning Classic Quizzes into New Quizzes with just a click of a button!

Full Course Import


When you begin importing content over to your fall course shells, be sure you use the 'Convert content to New Quizzes' button when doing a FULL course import. After selecting this button and beginning the import, it will automatically convert all Question Banks into Item Banks and Classic Quizzes to New Quizzes.



After completing a course import, faculty should check their course to ensure no issues have occurred. If any quizzes, questions, or banks are missing or incorrectly formatted, please reach out to eLearning Services.

Partial Course Import

When you are importing only select content from one course into another and you want to bring your quizzes into the new course shell, you must select all of the Quizzes and Question Banks in order for the 'Convert content to New Quizzes' button to work properly.



Handheld Device Flag for Respondus Monitor

Respondus Monitor has added a recent update of flagging handheld devices, such as phones, when students are being monitored during a test. With this new update, it will automatically flag handheld devices that are noticed in Monitor. However this setting can have the sensitivity adjusted if a handheld device is acceptable to have while taking a test, such as a student using a calculator for a math exam.

Join the Summer Migration

As a reminder, Classic Quizzes is being phased out and New Quizzes will be the only quiz platform starting in Fall 2025. eLearning Services wants to provide the best information for faculty to begin transferring Classic Quizzes to New Quizzes.

Faculty can best prepare for the transition from Classic Quizzes to New Quizzes by:

- 1. Creating New Quizzes from this point forward in your Canvas courses.
- Migrating Classic Quizzes to New Quizzes if the Classic Quizzes doesn't utilize Question Banks. To do this: click into Quizzes --> click the 'more options dots for a quiz' --> Migrate
- Contacting your Instructional Designer to begin the process of transferring Question Banks to Item Banks.

In addition to the quiz migration, summer is a great time to begin migrating your YouTube content to Panopto!

Here's how to get started:

- 1. Log in to your YouTube account and access your videos. Download each video as an .mp4 file.
- 2. Log in to Canvas and navigate to your course. Locate the YT video embed/link in the course and remove it.
- 3. In Edit mode, click the Panopto button in the content editor tool bar. Select the Upload tab. Drag and drop your video file into the box to upload!

Panopto will generate captions for your video, and you can also take advantage of great features like quizzing during playback, viewing statistics, class discussions on videos, and more!
