Choose the **Progress** tab to begin reviewing the student's advancement toward their degree.

At a Glance

The **At a Glance** information provides a quick overview of progress the student has made toward earning their degree.

- A. The current cumulative GPA along with a notation () of the minimum GPA required for the degree to be awarded. The type of degree, declared major, division, and catalog year. Catalog year can temporarily be changed to identify differences in requirements for other years during which a student was enrolled.
- B. Description: Clicking on **more** will provide general information about the major and career path.
- C. Program Notes: Clicking on Show Program Notes provides information pertaining to awarding of degrees, FERPA, transfer equivalencies, and earned development course credit.
- D. On the right side, are two color coded bars giving an indication of the following requirements.
 - Green bar:** represents the number of credits *completed*.
 - Light green bar:** credit hours for which the student is *actively registered*.
 - Light yellow bar:** credit hours *planned for future semesters* but for which student is not yet registered.
 - Total Credits bar:** represents the total credits completed, registered, or planned toward a degree. Includes requirements, transfer credits, developmental credits, etc..
 - Total Credits from this School:** represents progress toward the minimum of 32 (bachelors) or 16 (associate) credits required to be taken at LC State in order to earn a degree.
- E. **View A New Program:** Click here to temporarily view how Progress changes with a different major selected.

Requirements

The next section, **Requirements**, provides detail about the specific courses required for the chosen degree program. This will typically be broken into smaller categories. For example, the requirements for bachelor's degree may be broken into several broad categories, such as General Education Core Requirements, Major Requirements, Emphasis Requirements, Minor Requirements and Electives.

Within a category, you will see a color coded status for each specific requirement, as well as for the course(s) within that requirement. For instance, the below image shows a snapshot of courses needed by a sample student toward the Humanities general education requirement for undergraduates.

In the following example, using the Humanistic/Artistic section of the General Education Core, we can see that:

- A. Degree-seeking (AS, BS, BA, BAS) students are required to complete two courses from the three category choices. This example shows that this section of the core is **Fully Planned**.
- B. The student has **planned** a literature course for 2023FA.
- C. The student **completed** an art course in 2022FA.

Notes:

- When a section is Completed, the section will collapse. Details are available by clicking on the Show Details link (**Hide Details** collapses again).
- Section requirements use both **Courses** and **Credits** terminology. Credit minimums listed in decimals (for example 2.01) ensure that transfer credits meet the minimum requirement. A student can transfer credit from another institution that is based upon the quarter system. Quarter credits are multiplied by .67 to equal semester credits. For example, a 5 credit course will transfer to LC State as 3.35 credit (5x.67=3.35). A 3 credit course will transfer as 2.01 credits.
- When conducting a degree audit, all sections under Requirements must show **Completed** and/or **In-Progress**.

D. Humanistic/Artistic

Additional Sections: After **Requirements**, Progress shows additional areas that can be used to determine degree readiness.

36 Upper Division Credits—Progress for students seeking a bachelor’s degree will contain a section which lists advancement toward the 36 credit upper division requirement. Note that credits in this sections are found elsewhere in Progress, so should not be counted as *additional* completed credit toward the degree requirements. See truncated example below:

Note that this section merely provides a *count* of credits. It does not take into consideration how or which credits apply to the degree requirements in the student’s chosen major.
