Where you will be:

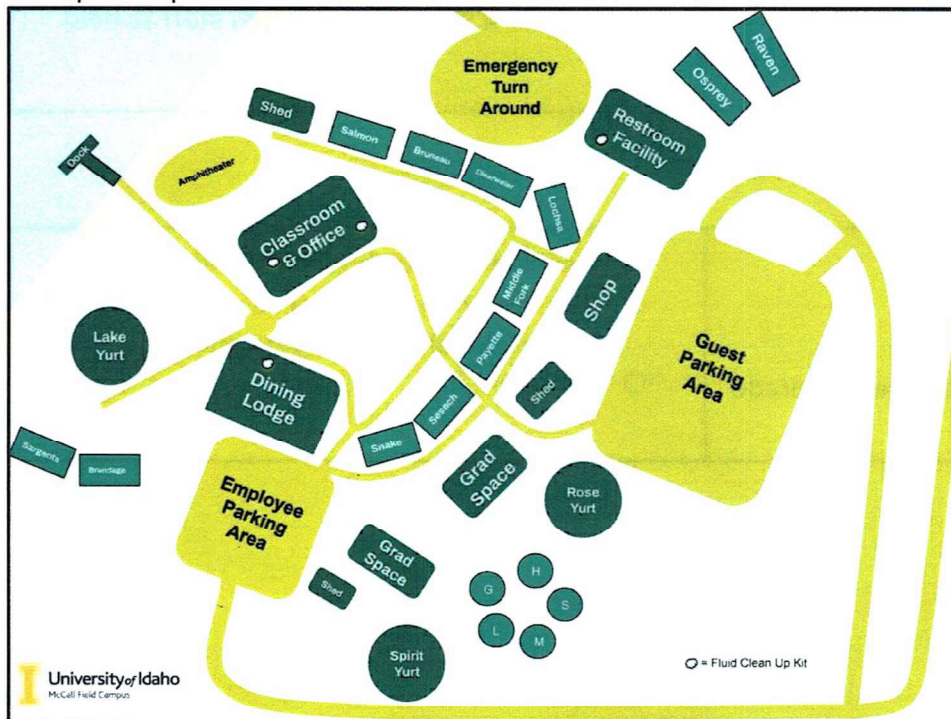

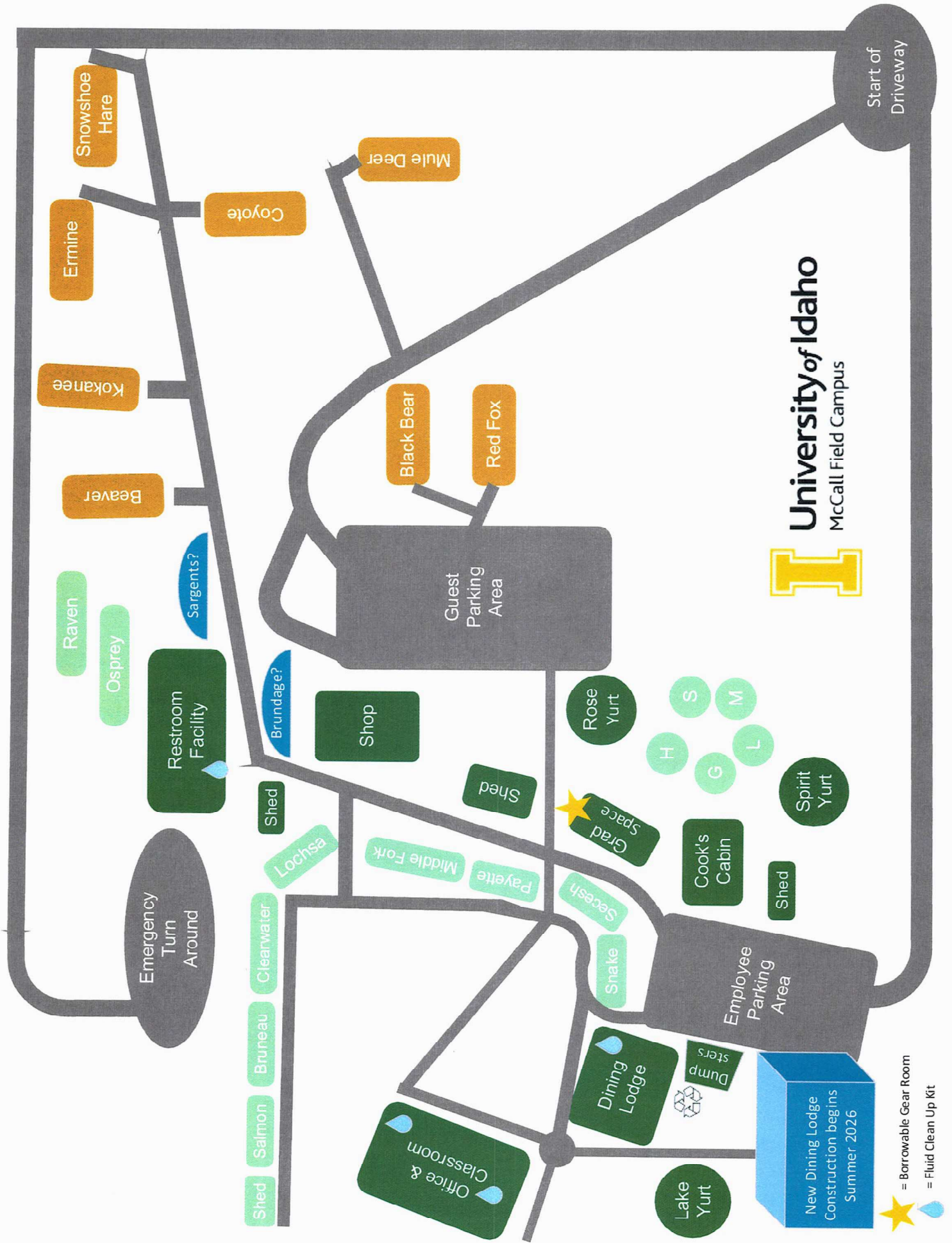
