## Monday Message March 3, 2025



Dear all,

Effectively serving our education mission means ensuring that students find their experiences and interactions to be meaningful and gratifying. As you may recall, annually we conduct an all-campus student survey; the purpose being to better understand student perceptions, concerns, expectations and experiences. Data collection took place over three weeks in November, with 490 students responding (response rate = 21%). The full survey report can be found on our <u>Teams intranet site</u>.

Respondents reported they were satisfied with their overall, academic, and social experiences, and found the information available on Canvas and the college website readily accessible and helpful. Respondents were satisfied with the availability of faculty outside of class, quality of faculty as teachers, availability of advisors and the quality of advising provided.

When asked how they heard about LC State, familiarity associated with growing up in the area, family friends, high school counselors and fairs, along with increased acknowledgement of LC marketing, promotion and recruit materials, events, tours and visitations topped the list. When asked why they chose LC State, respondents rated affordability, availability of financial aid/scholarships, quality of education and instruction, availability of the major they wanted to pursue and potential to get a good job, as well as face-to-face classes, as the most important factors. Overwhelmingly (85% of respondents) indicated their primary goal was to complete a bachelor's degree, with a third of the respondents planning to go on and pursue a graduate degree.

Among those who live on campus, respondents were satisfied with the safety, availability and condition of campus housing. They also rated the food service more favorable than in the past. As in the past, the majority of respondents indicated they were working while attending school, and over half noted that they had gotten food from the Warrior Food Pantry.

In terms of campus events, activities and engagement, nearly 60% attended the fall Career Fair, and nearly half indicated they have been involved in a student club or organization. When asked about their primary sources of information regarding campus events and activities, in addition to word-of-mouth, the student news email, campus flyers, social media (Instagram and Facebook), and DoMore App were winners.

When asked about their primary "concerns," they were neither concerned nor unconcerned about mental or emotional well-being (perhaps indicating the services and supports we are providing are meeting needs); were unconcerned about making friends, meeting new people, or feeling homesick; and similarly unconcerned about finding tutoring help, deciding a career path or finding a job (again, perhaps indicating our student success support services are meeting needs).

In keeping with our education mission, when queried about their interest in community events or activities (i.e., becoming engaged citizens), they were interested in voting, volunteering, helping fundraise for charity and contributing to solving community problems. Finally, when queried about their perceptions of campus climate, culture, sense of belonging, and safety, respondents indicated they felt LC State was friendly, respectful, caring, intellectual, inclusive, improving, accessible to people with physical disabilities, and not racist, sexist, or homophobic. In terms of a sense of campus community, respondents seemed to be seeking more in-person connection, placing increased importance on face-to-face classes, desiring more involvement outside of class, and placing increased importance on the high quality customer service we provide at LC State.

As in the past, these findings affirm that we are providing an education environment wherein Warriors can and do thrive. Proud to be a Warrior!

- **Campus Drilling:** As part of deferred maintenance program projects, LC State is are working to reduce stormwater impacts to buildings across campus. Geoprofessional Innovation Inc. will be on campus March 3-4 to dig holes to test water infiltration rates (amount of time it takes for stormwater to drain through the soil). GPI will be drilling near the following locations: Administration Building, Reid Centennial Hall, Talkington Hall, Expedition Hall, Sam Glenn Complex, Spalding Hall, and Clark Hall. The infiltration tests will take 2-3 hours and GPI will cover the holes during that time. The drilling will create a fair amount of noise outside. - **Cybersecurity Training:** The Idaho 2025 annual Cybersecurity Training campaign launched on March 1 in Luma and **must be completed by March 31.** Administered by the Idaho Office of Information Technology Services, this year's training covers Artificial Intelligence (10 mins), Data Privacy (10 mins), and Security Awareness (15 mins), totaling approximately 35 minutes.
