- 32 Residency (LC State) credits required for graduation.
- 36 credits must be upper division.
- Students must earn a C- in MATH, ECON, and PSYC 101
- Students must earn at least a "C-" in all major courses and at least a 2.5 GPA in all business courses combined, including Accounting & Economics.
- This is just a guide. Please check with your advisor to ensure you earn at least 32 credits at LC State and have completed 36 upper division credits
